



Middlesex College Food Pantry Donation









in the U.S. is Bakken oil. So, what is Bakken of 7 miles-per-hour highlights how unsafe oil? It is a form of crude oil that is light and sweet and comes from the Bakken Shale circumstances. Outside Casselton, ND, oil fields in North Dakota. There are only two economical ways to get that crude oil carrying Bakken oil collided with a 112-car from ND to the east coast. One of the ways, which most people are against, is through new underground pipelines. The other form of transportation is by railroad tanker cars which could have a disastrous effect on our country's infrastructure if/when a derailment occurs.

This Bakken crude is not like other types of oil that we have pumped from the fires of Bakken oil have occurred in Lacunderground. Bakken oil is volatile and ignites very easily and has been involved in multiple train accidents. What makes this oil different is the fact that it includes high amounts of natural gas liquids which is the reason for its volatility. Bakken crude is transported throughout the U.S. in railroad tank cars. Each tank car can carry 30,000 gallons of crude and each train consists of over 100 tank cars. So, in doing the math, we are looking at over 3 million gallons of a very volatile, toxic substance per tarin load. Would you feel comfortable with multiple train loads passing through your community each and every day? Unfortunately, these trains pass through New Jersey communities every day and regulations do not mandate that the communities must be notified of them.

What effects does a derailed Bakken oil train have on the local fire department? In all reality, it could become the largest conflagration of a lifetime for many a over 100 tank cars, it is a sure bet it is carrying firefighter. It doesn't matter where the Bakken crude oil on its way to a refinery. derailment and/or fire occurs, be it on a parked siding in a suburban community, a roll-over of tanker cars into a water source, or in a remote inaccessible rural setting, each one will have the potential of a major disaster.

On December 12, 2020, a train carrying over 100 tanker cars of Bakken oil derailed and caught fire in the small Washington town of Custer. The derailment occurred

Most of the crude oil that is transported despite the train traveling at the slow speed it is to transport Bakken oil under any a town of 2400 residents, a 106-car train train carrying grain and ignited. Though no injuries were reported, it was considered a catastrophe for the residents who were forced to evacuate as plumes of black smoke rose and spread from the crash site. Authorities said the fire would need to burn itself off because the blaze was too dangerous for the firefighters to approach. Other noted derailments and Megantic, Quebec Canada, where 47 people were killed; Buffalo, NY; Buhl, Alabama; and in a rural wooded inaccessible setting in West Virginia.

So now the question to pose to our local fire departments is, "Are we prepared for an incident of this magnitude if it occurred in our community?" The answer to that question is that no fire department can by itself prepare for an incident of that magnitude to occur in their community. But there is a multitude of resources available throughout the county and the state that can be called upon to assist in any incident. If these resources become overwhelmed, there are resources at the national level that could help when needed. Initially at a large-scale incident, our priority is to protect and rescue our residents followed by protecting property and then the environment.

The next time you see a long train with Let's all hope and pray that an incident of this magnitude never occurs in our community.

time in the city. Ring-a-ling, hear them ring, soon it will be Christmas Day."

Decades ago, going Christmas shopping didn't mean traveling to temperaturecontrolled malls to shop in comfort. For us, it had meant taking the bus to Perth Amboy to shop outside, often in bitterly cold weather. As children, we had bundled up in layers of mean we were Holiday shoppers; usually, clothing; put galoshes on our feet and either hats or heavy, woolen babushkas on our heads, before hurrying to the corner to wait for Red the Bus Driver to finally make his way through the hole-in-the-wall. When we had become young teenagers, that all changed... gone were the hats and gloves. Wearing skirts, our legs had been bare and our coats were left unbuttoned. Stoically, for the sake of what our young minds had considered "looking cool," we used to freeze ourselves almost to death. What didn't change was that we still had to wait endlessly for Red the Bus Driver to come along.

Christmastime in the City of PerthAmboy was exciting to us, with Holiday shoppers filling Smith Street, the stores all decorated with garlands and wreaths, and Salvation

Army Santas everywhere you looked. There were so many of them: short and tall, thin and fat, and all wearing ill-fitted red suits that had seen far, far better days. "HO! HO! HO! MERRY CHRISTMAS!!" they had shouted, as they waved their "silver bells' ' in the air, competing with each other to get donations

dropped into their big, black kettles. Even to South Amboy. with their fake white beards partly dangling from their faces, seeing them year after year was an important part of Christmastime to us in that much simpler time of long ago.

Having Red come to a stop across from Woolworth's, my friends, Nancy and Rosanne, and I would hurry down the bus steps as soon as the doors wheezed open. With the frigid air whipping its way around the 5 corners, we'd "jayrun" across Smith Street between all the cars coming and going, while laughing uncontrollably the entire time. With the excitement of Christmas coming, the innate joy of being young and being together, without anyone telling us how to act and what to do, our laughter knew no bounds. Then, again, it never did when the three of us were together.

Reaching the other side, we'd eagerly look through the store windows, with their glass fronts wet with condensation, trying to see their displays. As we did, we'd hear the stores' Christmas Carols playing inside

"Silver bells, Silver bells, it's Christmas mingling with the noise from the cars and buses going up and down the street. All of these years later, the crunching sound of the snow chains and the flapping noise the broken chains had made remain entwined with my Christmastime childhood memories. It seems I can't have one without the other.

Going to Perth Amboy didn't always we were just Holiday "lookers," as kids, then, rarely had any extra money to spend. So, instead of spending money, we had "spent time" by going into stores to find ugly clothes that made us laugh, or putting stupid looking hats on our heads to entertain each other. Laughing, we'd quickly leave to go to another store whenever a saleswoman appeared from behind the racks to give us the evil eye.


On the rare occasions we did buy something, the woman behind the counter would always ask, "Wanna box for that?" Whether we had wanted one or not, we always took it because we never passed up anything that was free. If we were really lucky, we'd even be given a paper shopping bag, with handles like hemp, so, we could put

our few things together and take turns carrying it. When we weren't lucky, we could have bought one for 5 cents, but we never did. Having parents shaped by the Depression, 5 cents was just too much "good money" to spend. Besides, 5 cents had some value, only a nickel more would be enough to pay for the bus trip back

As "home by supper" was our curfew, we'd begrudgingly trudge our way to Woolworth's corner to wait for Red. By then, we were beyond "cool;" we were frozen. With our coats buttoned to our necks, our collars lifted. to shield our almost frost-bitten ears from the freezing air, our noses running, and our numb hands tucked deeply within our pockets, we'd stand huddled together trying to keep warm on legs that had felt like blocks of ice. As we stood waiting, children would be smiling at us while we laughed as only the young at Christmastime can laugh. When Red finally came, the last sounds we had heard as we boarded the bus to go home were all the Santas' bells pealing the news that it was Christmastime in the city.

"Children laughing, people passing, meeting smile after smile, and on every street corner you'd hear,,,Silver bells, Silver bells, it's Christmastime in the city."





Does Santa Have Back Pain?

Santa Claus may be able to travel around the world in a single night, but when it comes to his health, he's no Superman. That bowl full of jelly, a diet rich in fatty cookies and a lack of regular exercise all put Santa at risk for back pain.

Santa is a perfect candidate for back problems - He's overweight. The same holds true for us mortals. Sometimes the cause of your back problems is not your back, but your front: your "spare tire" may be the cause of your aching back. And the solution to your back problem may not involve a pill or surgery.

Your spine is the central support of your entire skeletal system. It is designed for strength to support your body weight and flexibility to allow movement. When healthy, your spine is S shaped with three natural curves. When these curves are in balance, your body weight is evenly distributed. To maintain this alignment, you need to have strong and flexible muscles in your back, legs and abdomen. The abdominal muscles are especially important in supporting the spine.

A potbelly changes the curvature of the back. The stomach pulls the backbone forward, stressing muscles and ligaments and putting pressure on discs. If you have ten extra pounds on your abdomen, you are putting an additional 100 pound strain on your back. This additional strain occurs because the lower part of your spine is not receiving adequate support from your weakened abdominal muscles. Your back muscles try to maintain the proper spinal balance, but end up strained or sprained.

Although excess weight does not cause back problems, you can do something about it. Follow a diet and exercise program to maintain a healthy weight and strengthen your muscles. Develop healthy eating habits that work for you. And make exercise, diet and proper spinal hygiene an important part of your day.

The Munster Koach appeared in over twenty episodes throughout the series' two-year run, and was also seen in Munster, Go Home! using different wheels. 




