in different scenarios that we expect to occur. We practice crawling on our knees through smokey atmospheres and how to carry someone to safety and away from the fire and heat. We continue to train for whatever scenario we respond to, be it an insignificant event or a major conflagration. We train to be proficient in all aspects of firefighting and rescues. But do we train to deal with the residents in our communities when they are experiencing the worst day of their lives? They are calling us for help, for whatever reason, and they may be very excited and unable to communicate valuable information to us. When we arrive on scene and witness the situation, we already have a plan of attack in mind. But there is one area of training that most firefighters are lacking and that is dealing with individuals that cannot communicate with us or may become afraid of us. How do we deal with individuals who have autism? Firefighters should be aware that people with autism can't be identified by appearance. They look the same as anyone else. They're identified by their behaviors. Some people with autism do not have a typical range of sensations and may not feel the cold, heat, or pain in a typical manner. They may be hypo or hypersensitive. They may show an unusually painful response that could include laughter, humming, singing, and removing clothing. Speak in short clear phrases such as, "Get In", "Sit Down", or "Wait Here." If you can get their name then use that for each direction you give, they may not make eye contact with you. It may take a while for you to get an answer if at all. How prevalent is autism in the United States? In

In the fire service we train in how to 2021, the CDC reported that approximately use our apparatus, tools, equipment, and 1 in 44 children in the U.S. is diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Boys are four times more likely to be diagnosed with autism than girls. 31% of children with ASD have an intellectual disability. Someone with autism is 7 times more likely to have an encounter with emergency services. Some point in your career, you will encounter Autism either personally or professionally. What can we do as first responders to help the situation when we encounter a person with autism during an emergency situation? Speak calmly, allow time for a response to questions or directions, repeat the request or words, talk in short and direct phrases, and make one request at a time. Use calm body language, avoid abrupt moves or actions. Do not crowd the person, allow as much room as possible. Avoid waving arms or using a lot of hand gestures. Do not pat their shoulders or touch their face unless necessary for examination or removing them to a safe location. Do not attempt to stop repetitive motions unless they are potentially harmful to themselves or others. Do not leave unattended or unsupervised. Be alert to sudden attempts to re-enter a burning dwelling or occupancy to retrieve pets or items of security such as toys, stuffed animals, or blankets. When responding to a known location where autistic children are present, it is advisable to shut down all emergency strobe/warning lights and sirens as these may exacerbate the situation. Unfortunately, in most of our responses we may not be aware that an autistic person is involved in our emergency call. Always keep that thought in the back of your mind when responding, how will you react?

Joe Bottil to be Induced in National Boxing Hall of Fame Class of 2024.

released its list of legends to be inducted Academy of Sayreville N.J. 's head boxing coach, Joe Botti. "When I received the call from the Hall of Fame's director that I was selected I was speechless. It truly is a once in a lifetime honor," said Botti. Botti is no stranger to awards as he was previously selected Trainer of the Year by the New Jersey Golden Gloves and was enshrined in the N.J. Boxing Hall of Fame in November of 2023. Botti will be the only 2024 inductee from New Jersey.

Botti has been involved in the sport of boxing for 46 years. He has been a fighter, trainer, manager, gym owner, promoter and author. Botti ran one of the most successful boxing gyms in the United States, from 1989 to 2013. Amateurs, professionals, world ranked boxers as well as world champions frequented Botti's gym. In 2022 Botti returned to training boxers at the Strategic Academy in Sayreville, NJ after the gym's long time boxing trainer, Dan Doyle, moved to Florida. Botti admits, "The most enjoyable part of teaching for me is taking a kid that knows nothing about the sport and guiding him to his first amateur and professional victory." Botti's fighters have been showcased on all the major networks from HBO, Showtime, ESPN to the MSG network. Botti is a retired police Captain. "Although training successful fighters is very exciting," Botti states, "the most satisfying thing for me is when I run into a former fighter years later and he tells me how boxing saved his life. Being a boxing coach is like being a surrogate father."

Botti not only trains males to fight, in

The National Boxing Hall of Fame has 1994 he became the first promoter in the New York/New Jersey metropolitan area to in 2024. Among those selected is Strategic match two female boxers against each other. "U.S.A. amateur boxing had just legalized female boxing," Botti recalled, "and I decided to put a female match on one of my amateur shows. I had to use two females from my own gym because I couldn't find any other female fighters to match them against." Botti recalled that other trainers in the male dominated sport tried to stop him from putting the bout on. "Quite a few friends in the sport kept telling me that I was going to ruin boxing. The night of the show the venue was packed. It was standing room only and national television came to cover the event. The funny thing is, after the successful bout, most of the trainers who were giving me a hard time started training females themselves," Botti recalls with a laugh.

Botti has written two books on the sport; Thunder & Lightning: The Fighting Gatti Brothers, which chronicles the lives and boxing careers of world champion Arturo Gatti and his brother Joe. Botti also wrote a book titled Joe Jennette: Boxing's Ironman which details the career and struggles of biracial boxer Joe Jennette, who competed from 1904 to 1922, and competed in the longest boxing match of the 20th Century. Botti is currently working on his third tome on colorful boxing promoter Don Elbaum.

Botti will be enshrined on April 24, 2024 in San Clemente, California along with "Sugar" Shane Mosley, Marco Antonio Barrera, Ronald "Winky" Wright, Micky Ward and Arturo Gatti [posthumously] among others.

Pat Douglas & The Bombers By Tom Burkard

Place in the Melrose section of Sayreville has led a most interesting life. From his South Amboy Little Fellas League days when he played with the Daylight Bakery team to the present as player/manager of two championship caliber men's softball teams, the Vintage Bombers, and also the Prime Time Bombers, he has accomplished so much. In addition, Pat and his softball teams have raised thousands of dollars by organizing fundraisers through the years for kids with cancer.

Pat and his two older brothers, Steve and Scott grew up loving baseball like so many other local kids did years ago. The Melrose section of Sayreville was loaded with standout athletes such as Steve Makwinski, Bill D'Amico, Bruce Buckiewicz, Mike Kosmoski, Jay Buckiewicz, Johnny Kozak, Andy and Les Wilson, Fran Fee, Ed Covell, and Ed Skarzynski. Pat said "The Sayreville/ South Amboy area was a great place to grow up in, and my brothers and I felt like we belonged to both towns. Sayreville kids from Melrose and also Tom Kelly from Evelyn Terrace were allowed to play in South Amboy. We owe thanks to South Amboy's Recreation Director Johnny Zdanewicz for letting us play."

In 1968, the Douglas brothers Steve, Scott and Pat were part of a history-making Daylight Bakery Little Fellas League team that was the first in history to have an unbeaten season, as they captured the championship. Steve, who was a senior at Sayreville War Memorial HS at the time, was the manager of this now legendary club. Makwinski was the ace pitcher, who went on to a phenomenal high school, and college baseball and basketball career. Following his pitching days with the Sayreville Bombers, he was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals baseball club, but opted to attend FDU. Steve and Scott helped Makwinski in his earlier days as a pitcher, especially with his pitching control.

Pat had a couple of great memories of the '68 team, and said, "My brother Steve coached/managed Scott and me, and it was like we won the championship together. Bruce Buckiewicz, who was 15 or 16 at the time was an assistant coach, and my dad also coached the team." Pat shared a humorous recollection, saying "I was the center fielder, and when Steve was pitching, I dug a hole with my spikes, because when he pitched, I never had a ball hit out there." Pat will never forget the final game, which he played a huge part in, and recalled, "In the final game, Jay Buckiewicz hit a single to right field, and I tripled him in, and Makwinski singled me in, and we won the title, 2-0."

The Douglas boys were close, and Pat stated "My brothers influenced who I rooted for, and I looked up to them as good examples,

Melrose also had some very talented musicians back in the day including the Fee brothers Fran and Tim, the Standowski brothers Rich and Bob, Emerson Jones, Joe Schien, Mike Melnick, and Drew Cross. Fran Fee is still currently rocking with the Clem & Friends Band, while Pat Douglas played keyboards and said, "I took organ lessons for a couple years." It seems like he has always been musically inclined, and it is probably the reason that he lists singing Karaoke as one of his favorite hobbies.

So, when did the softball craze really hit Pat? He worked at Rutgers University for 36 years prior to retirement, and while there, he was asked by a coworker to help her organize a softball game. When it didn't work out, and they were the only two who showed at the softball field, they played catch, and "that's when I got the idea," he said. "In the summer of 2013, I called Timmy Reardon and asked him to help me organize a team, and between the 2 of us, we got a bunch of guys, 2 teams for an alumni game. I managed one team and Timmy managed the other. We lost by 1 run. After that game, Dennis Ahern sent a message on Facebook and wanted to keep it going, so we got guys from the alumni game, and others to practice. I looked for a 50's and Over League online, and contacted the Middlesex County Senior Over 50 Years League for the 2014 season, which was our first. We had no official team name at that point, so I asked all the players to suggest a name. Scott Kominkiewicz came up with the name Vintage Bombers, and that has stuck with us ever since."

The team had a tough year in their initial season turning in a (4-26) record, but Douglas, an excellent judge of talent "got better players," the next year, and the Bombers won the C Division title, but bowed in the playoffs in the Middlesex County Over 50 League. In '16, "We went to the finals in the B Division, and came close. That was the year Chuck Prusakowski came on board, and batted a fantastic .800." Prusakowski, not too long ago was selected to the prestigious Softball Hall of Fame, in addition to being chosen the greatest Slow Pitch Softball Player in the history of South Amboy/Sayreville by a special committee for The South Amboy-Sayreville Times newspaper.

In 2017, the Vintage Bombers picked up another legendary softball superstar, first baseman Steve Samra. In 10 seasons since the team started playing competitively, they have captured 4 Division titles, 2 in B Division, and 1 in the A. They have made 6 appearances in the finals. This year, they lost a heartbreaker in the final inning of the championship game. Pat said, "I'm proud

Coach Douglas is a very busy man, and in 2018, he started another team, the Prime Time Bombers. This talented ballclub plays at the Old Bridge fields. Billy D'Amico was with me from the start of both teams, and is still with me. "Mak" Steve Makwinski played a couple of seasons for both teams. Our Prime Time Bombers won the championship in 2022, and are always near the top, said Douglas. Pat also heaped praise on Ed Last, who was "My assistant coach for 9 years, and kept perfect stats. He stepped down this past season." In addition, Douglas praised his fans, saying "I appreciate our fans that show up often, and cheer us on."

He also said that "My biggest thrill in sports is the hundreds of friendships I have made that would not have been possible had it not been for softball. Not only among my teammates and those associated with the Bombers, but throughout the leagues I play in. I count myself blessed. If I had to name one reason why I continue to do this, it would be friendships. I think that is really the reason any of us do it."

Following the season, Pat organizes and runs an annual banquet for the players and others. They recently held their 10th annual banquet at the Sayreville Knights of Columbus Hall, and 70 people attended.

Coach Pat Douglas and all his talented, dedicated and generous softball players have not only excelled on the field, but also with their wonderful charity works. Since 2015, they have raised thousands of dollars with their fundraiser for Camp Quality, an organization for children with cancer. Their goal is to help "kids to be kids again." Youngsters are sent for a 5-day summer camp.

Congratulations to Pat Douglas, and all of his teammates on the Vintage Bombers, and Prime Time Bombers softball teams on their great success, and also their dedicated and caring humanitarian efforts for the less player-Aaron Judge.






