Sayreville Councilwoman **Eunice Dwumfour**

Borough Mourns Councilwoman

The Borough of Sayreville and local communities were shocked when they heard the news that Sayreville Councilwoman Eunice Dwumfour, 30, was found shot to death in an SUV near her home at La Mer in Sayreville on February 1st, around 7:20 p.m. She had been shot multiple times, and the vehicle rolled down the street and crashed into a parked Mercedes Benz.

Eunice was elected to the Borough Council in November 2021 for a 3-year term, and was also a member of the Sayreville Human Relations Commission. The American flag was flying half-staff, and buntens were draped over the entrance to the building, out of respect and memory to the Councilwoman.

Dwumfour, who was considered by many, a rising star in the Republican Party, served as Assistant Pastor in Champions Royal Assembly USA Campus Ministry, and also a Youth Leader at the Church of Pentecost USA Inc. Newark Assembly. She was also an EMT with the Sayreville Emergency Squad, and a proud graduate of William Paterson University.

GOP Chairwoman Karen Bailey Bebert, remembered her as "sweet, soft-spoken and a very religious and beautiful person. She always had that beautiful smile on her face. She wanted to make our community a better place for all of our children." Sayreville Mayor Victoria Kilpatrick said in a release that "She was a woman of deep faith, and worked hard to integrate her strong Christian beliefs into her daily life as a person and a community leader."

anniversary of "The Station" fire in West Warwick, Rhode Island. Some of you may remember that deadly and tragic incident that took the lives of one hundred patrons. "The Station" was a popular nightclub in the area and was known to host rock bands on the weekends. The building itself was a single-story wood frame, type V construction measuring seventy-five feet across the front and sixty-eight feet deep. It consisted of two bars, a lounge, bathrooms, offices, seating area, dance floor, and four exits. On this night, the band "Great White" was preparing to start their performance at 11:00pm. During the band's opening song Desert Moon, pyrotechnics were set off by the tour manager. This pyrotechnic display was meant to arouse the audience and enhance the effects of the band's first song of the evening. As the pyrotechnics were ignited, they in turn ignited flammable acoustic foam on both sides and area will be pushed from those behind them. top of the drummer's alcove and the back of the stage. February 20th marked the twentieth In less than one minute, the entire stage was engulfed in flames as the band members fled toward the west exit by the stage. The building's fire alarm had been activated by this time. Although there were four exits to use, most people headed for the front doors through which they entered. People are creatures of habit and most all attempt to exit through the same door they entered. The ensuing stampede led to a crush in the narrow hallway leading to the exit, quickly blocking the exit completely and resulting in numerous deaths and injuries. What we want to take away from this tragic event is to always maintain our situational awareness. As you enter any venue where a large crowd is expected, look around for exit signs/doors and how you approach them if needed. Remember that when an emergency occurs, people will tend to panic and there will be a surge at any exit door. People exiting from a congested People will trip and fall causing the exit to on those in the rear attempting to escape. You can tell people to stay calm during an emergency but that seldom is the case. This type of situational awareness should people expected to evacuate in an emergency. It is very important for our fire inspectors to inspect these venues making sure no exits are blocked or locked at any time the building is occupied. South Amboy resident John Erbetta didn't know what to do with it. Erbetta said he was helping Atkins clean out her basement when he saw the jail door. She told him the original owner of the house, Joe Smith, acquired the door in 1970 after the jail was torn down. She offered him the door but he

Jan Williams of the Historical Society of South Amboy, who said he would get back to him. The Historical Society arranged with Erbetta to pick up the jail door from the basement. Former South Amboy Police Chief Jerry Pizzillo, Jan Williams, Bruce Grzankowski, and Mike Springer, went down to the Atkins cellar and carefully carried the approximately 500 pound door to the back of Pizzillo's pickup truck. John Erbetta is glad to see the jail door has a new home. "I'm glad they got it. You don't come across that stuff very often. If Joe Smith hadn't wanted the door, it probably would've gone to the scrap yard," he said.

Valentine's Day Is For Chocolate Lovers

Dark chocolate seems to lower blood pressure, but it requires an amount less than 2 Hershey Kisses to do it. A small study from Germany adds to mounting evidence linking dark chocolate with certain health benefits such as lowering blood pressure and having an anti-inflammatory effect.

A study appeared in the Journal of the American Medical Association by Dr. Dick Taubert of the University of Cologne. It demonstrated that blood pressure reductions with dark chocolate were small but still substantial enough to potentially reduce cardiovascular disease risks.

Volunteers for the study ate just over 6 grams of dark chocolate daily for almost 5 months. It equaled about

1¹/₂ Hershey Kisses. People who ate that amount ended up with lower blood pressure reading that those who ate a similar amount of white chocolate. Tests suggested that a steady exposure to dark chocolate prompted a chemical change that helped dilate blood vessels and regulate blood pressure. Cocoa contains flavanols, plant based compounds that are also credited with giving red wine its heart healthy benefits.

Dr. Laura Sevetkey director of Duke University Hypertension center stresses that the study results should not be viewed as a license to gorge on chocolate. The weight gain from eating large amounts of dark chocolate would counteract any benefits.

As always an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. The combination of losing weight, eating less salt, exercising, and eating dark chocolate provides strategies to lower your blood pressure.
