The 2022-23 winter hasn't started in South Amboy and Sayreville. No measurable snow has fallen making it one of the latest seasons to record this. The National Weather Service defines measurable snow as one tenth of one inch of snow on the ground. New Brunswick, New York City, Atlantic City, and Philadelphia also have no snow while Newark has recorded one tenth of one inch. The lack of snow has harmed local hardware stores, snow plow operators, and ski areas. Barry Muraszko of Total Hardware in Sayreville says the lack of snow has hurt business.

"There's a lull because of the lack of snow" Muraszko said he hopes for a change. "Two or three storms would help." He said they sell snow throwers, snow shovels, rock salt, de-icers, and ice scrapers and sales are well below average. He would like to see some snow in February and March. Meteorologists say for significant snow in our area, storm systems must go offshore allowing cold air from Canada to combine with Atlantic Ocean moisture and create snowfall. That hasn't happened this season.

**HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTH AMBOY
A BLAST FROM THE PAST**

In the past several weeks a dredging operation has begun at the new ferry site located down by the old coal docks. The dredging operation is to accommodate the new ferry slips and terminal for future ferry operation to New Your City. As part of the dredging operation an Industrial Archaeologist has to be present to oversee the dredging operation. As we are aware, this site is in close proximity to the 1950 Power Pier Explosion which took the lives of 33 men and caused millions of dollars in damage to the City of South Amboy. On May 19, 1950, 420 tons of military explosives suddenly detonated, causing four transfer barges and several railroad cars to explode. The archaeologist's responsibility is to determine if any objects that are dredged up are of any historical significance. As of this writing there have been several items that have been dredged up. Several large pieces of torn and ripped metal have been dredged up. It has been determined that these pieces are from barges that were transporting the land mines and dynamite that were being loaded onto barges from railroad cars which were at the Power Pier. After several Congressional and Coast Guard Hearings following the explosion, the cause of the explosion was never determined.

On December 29, 2022, President of the Historical Society, Mary Szaro along with Joe Szaro and this writer met with Lauren Cook, the Industrial Archaeologist to view the remnants of the pieces of the barges and other artifacts that were dredged up. Mr. Cook explained that after the remnants are dredged up, his job is to measure and catalog the items for a report that has to be submitted to several federal and state entities. Also what is dredged up becomes the property of the Historical Society. Upon inspection of the items found, one could imagine the force of such a blast that would cause ¼ inch steel plating to be torn and ripped apart. Some of the metal rivets that held the steel pieces together, were ripped apart from the blast. Once the pieces are released they will be placed in the historical gallery, to be displayed as part of the history of South Amboy from this devastating blast that rocked the city on May 19, 1950.

SMOKE COLUMN

There is a menace on our highways that many motorists pay little attention to. We see these vehicles everyday as they crisscross our highways, they are the gasoline tankers. These tankers are a constant sight as they travel from the refineries to your local gas stations. Most of these tankers are driven by independent drivers who are paid by the load. The more loads they make, the more money they make. Tanker drivers will speed on the highways in order to increase the amount of deliveries they can make in one night, which it-turn makes it more profitable. Does this way of thinking pose a danger to our roadways? Tanker rollovers and fires are more common than people know. There are some communities that are notorious for these types of accidents especially where there is a sharp bend or curve in the roadway. Route #9 in Old Bridge has had three gasoline tanker rollovers in one area alone. As the tanker is en route to its destination with as much as eight-thousand gallons of a product, the gasoline is "safe" if it is contained inside the aluminum tanker. It is when that tanker is damaged and the product escapes that this gasoline becomes a hazardous material. In the past few years, we have seen news reports of disastrous roadway accidents involving gasoline tankers. Some of our readers may remember the tanker rollover on Route #9 southbound in Sayreville in 2004. At approximately 3:00am, this tanker was barreling down the highway with a full load of gasoline destined for local gas stations. With a limited amount of traffic on the highway at that time of the night, the driver exceeded the posted speed limit as he rounded the bend in the roadway and his left rear wheels rubbed up against the "Jersey barrier" which caused him to veer right and rollover. The tanker rolled over 180 degrees and immediately burst into flames. The flaming gasoline poured from the ruptured tanker and rolled down the highway until it reached the storm sewers where it seeped into the pipes. Fireballs leaped from other storm sewer

basins throughout a residential area. Luckily, there were no injuries to the driver or first responders in this incident but the clean-up was a massive undertaking and the roadway had to be resurfaced. Another infamous tanker accident occurred on a roadway underneath a New York Thruway overpass. This accident left one person dead and damaged the bridge which was an essential thoroughfare causing traffic chaos from Maryland to Albany. It was estimated to take a year to build a permanent replacement bridge at an estimated price tag of over \$1 million. One of the biggest traffic tanker accidents occurred on the lower roadway approach to the Oakland Bay Bridge in Oakland CA. This area is called "The Maze " because there are so many loops and connecting ramps to the various highways and bridges in the Bay area. CHP reported that the driver was traveling too fast when his truck overturned and burst into flames. As firefighters approached the scene, they noticed that the upper connector ramp was buckling from the intense heat of the fire as well as bolts melting from the steel girders. Due to the location of this incident, which was not near any structures, it was better to let itself burn out. Massive amounts of water and foam would have been needed to suppress the fire. The amount of runoff from this foam mixture would have been detrimental to the Bay waters. Keeping this information in mind as you travel the roadways, be aware of those eight thousand gallon tankers alongside you. Remember that they need room to maneuver their tanker and they cannot stop suddenly!

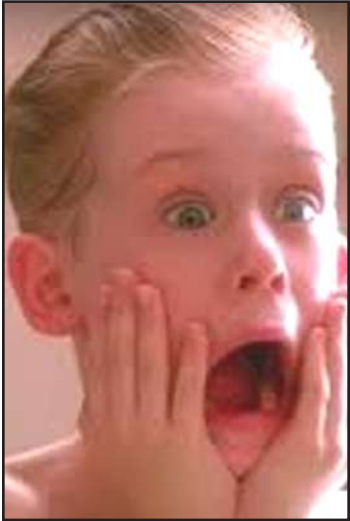

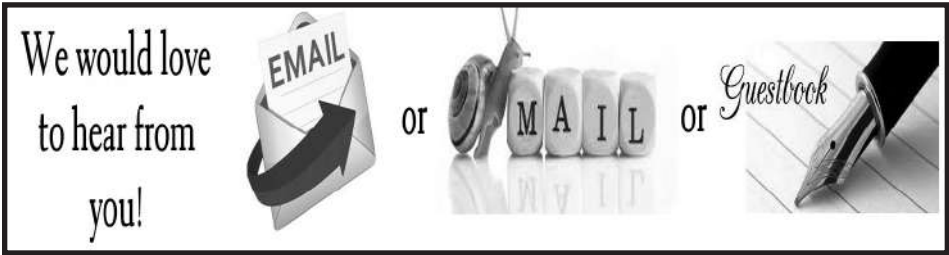



Cold Weather Exercise

Exercising outdoors in cold weather can be exhilarating. Even if skiing isn't your all-time favorite sport, you can have just as much fun running, cycling, or walking in winter time. Winter sunlight can revive your spirits, and exercise in the cool, crisp air can relieve the stress and tension related to the busy holidays.

There are special considerations to remember for cold-weather exercise:

Athletes may not be aware of the loss of fluids in cold weather, but the loss is real and potentially dangerous. Athletes have similar hydration needs year round, but many of them simply don't drink enough fluids during the winter months. Sports nutrition experts advise athletes to drink about one quart of non-caffeinated fluids for every 1,000 calories expended each day. "Drink two cups of fluid two hours before exercise and at least 4-6 ounces of fluid every 15-20 minutes during exercise."

Don't overdose. Exercise raises body temperatures significantly and even a moderate workout can make you feel as if it's 30 degrees warmer. The answer to this is wearing several layers of loose-fitting thin layers of clothes.

The first layer should be thermal underwear made of a fabric that draws perspiration away from your body. That layer should not be cotton, as cotton holds moisture next to your skin and makes you feel cold and clammy.

Your middle layer should be a synthetic turtleneck and wool swather. Sweat pants or Lycra tights worn over thermals will help keep your legs warm. If precipitation is evident, your outer jacket should be waterproof, wind-resistant, yet breathable. Or for a short workout in dry weather, just an ordinary windbreaker would be suitable.

Zipppers make clothes more adaptable for controlling the amount of air you let in or for removing quickly. Mittens are warmer than gloves. Fingers resting against each other stay warmer than fingers separated by the added air surface between the fingers of gloves.

Headgear is important since you lose so much heat through your head. Be sure to wear good running shoes, with enough support and cushion.



60 Years Ago Hoffman Ruled Group I Basketball

March 23, 1963 is one of the most memorable in South Amboy sports history. Under the leadership of Coach Jim Croddick, the Hoffman High School boys basketball team invaded Atlantic City’s Convention Hall in quest of the N.J.S.I.A.A. Group I state championship. The Guvs (14-7) were considered the Cinderella team in the tourney, and were huge underdogs against the highly-explosive Wood Ridge (20-2) team. The Purple and Gold battled its way to the title showdown by trouncing Henry Hudson Regional 70-48, and Wildwood, 80-64 in the semifinals. The Guvs’ starting five was composed of local basketball legends, John Lange, Ken Wahler, Manny Formoso, Jerry Drill and Dennis Wood. The ready reserves were Mike “Woody” McCarthy, Chet Meinzer, Ted Reick, Jim Odom and Paul Nagy.

There were 5,000 spectators who witnessed the title showdown, which was a see-saw contest, as the lead changed hands numerous times. With only 0:02 seconds showing on the scoreboard, and the Guvs trailing 56-54, Wahler saved the game by firing in a beautiful, clutch 10-foot jumper from the side, to send the contest into overtime. In the extra session, Lange came through by scoring four of Hoffman’s seven points, as the hometown kids outscored Wood Ridge, 7-4 to capture the Group I State Championship, 63-60. The victory marked Hoffman’s first state basketball title in 23 years. Lange burned the nets for 26 points and Wahler added 16 to lead the champions. Immediately following the game, the players praised Coach Jim Croddick. Lange said that, “Mr. Croddick is the nicest guy in the world. He taught us all we know about basketball. If it wasn’t for him, we wouldn’t be here right now with the trophy.” Jerry Drill said that, “It’s all the coach. He was the one that told us how to win. We just played the game.” The ‘63 state champs were superheroes around South Amboy. They were honored by various organizations with banquets and dinners, but most memorable to me as a 12-year old fan in awe of these superstars was the huge parade, which lasted over an hour. Coaches, players, and cheerleaders were driven around the city in 10 convertibles, while spectators cheered “our boys” wildly. The legendary Cloverleaf String Band provided musical entertainment for locals who lined the streets. The cheerleaders,

whose spirit and encouragement inspired the players throughout the season were captain Cynthia Kurtz, Sandra McCook, Ann Marie Stankowitz, Ruth Rittenhouse, Elaine Read, Margaret Smith, Kathleen Tarallo, and Joyce Letts. Dora Vogel was the cheerleaders’ coach. The champions received many individual honors and awards following the season. Lange-1st Team All-County, 1st Team All-State Group I; Formoso-2nd Team All-County; Wahler-3rd Team All-County, 3rd Team All-State Group I; Wood-Honorable Mention All-County, Honorable Mention All-State Group I; Drill-Honorable Mention All-County, Honorable Mention All-State Group I.

A few members of the ‘63 champions commented on their big moment in South Amboy sports history:

Jerry Drill “Kenny Wahler put in the biggest shot in the history of South Amboy basketball to tie the game and send it into overtime. John Lange also had a huge game for us.”

Ken Wahler “A lot of people give me all the credit for making the shot to send the game into overtime, but when we went into the huddle, there was no set play. It was going to whoever got open, and I happened to be open.”

John Lange “I’ll always remember the unity and togetherness. We were really a team! The most important thing was winning. It was started by Coach Croddick. He gave us our attitude. We were all good friends off the court as well. We didn’t have a lot of depth on the team. Our team played sick or hurt for three-quarters of the year. I had bronchitis. Kenny Wahler was the only one that was healthy all year.”

I’ll always remember listening intently to WCTC radio in our kitchen, and rooting for Hoffman in that championship game. I also remember hearing a very jubilant Coach Croddick being interviewed after the victory. This Hoffman team was a group of great guys, not only players, but they were also fine young men, who gave us pre-teens in South Amboy someone to look up to, and try to emulate, and possibly become champions someday, just like Coach Croddick’s championship contingent. That one magical night in March 1963 will live on in history as one of South Amboy’s greatest and proudest moments in sports.

35 Years Ago: St. Mary’s Wins CYO Title

1988-St. Mary’s won the championship of the Middlesex County CYO 7th and 8th Grade Basketball League by defeating St. Stanislaus of Sayreville. The Saints, who played without starting forward Corey DeBlis, who was out with a knee injury, were paced by Leo Cannon with 16 points, Chris Bratus 12, Tom Kelly 7, Joe Reilly 6, and Al D’Agostino 5 points. Reserves Brian Noble and Matt Cannon turned in solid performances for the champs. The victory was the third title the talented basketeers captured during the

season, and they finished with an outstanding record of (31-2). The League consisted of 10 teams: St. Mary’s, South Amboy; Immaculate Conception, Spotswood; Our Lady of Victories, Sayreville; St. Stanislaus, Sayreville; St. James, Woodbridge; Holy Family, Carteret; St. Joseph, Carteret; St. Cecilia, Iselin; St. John Vianney, Colonia; Sacred Heart, South Amboy.

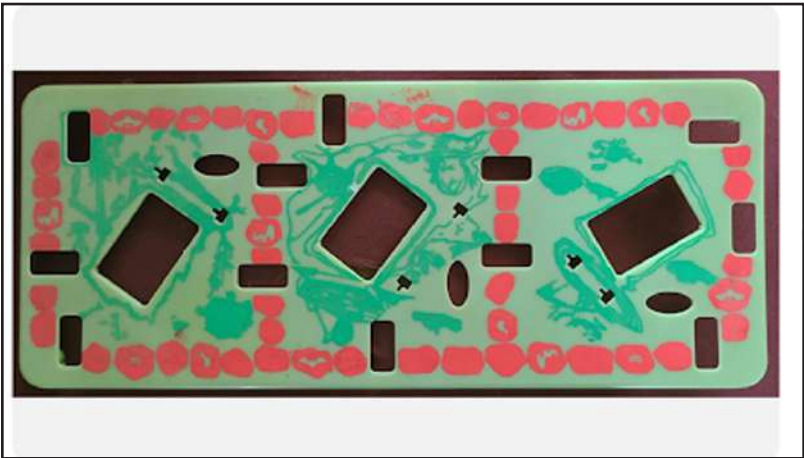

It slowed up in mid- November and last year's hot spot in Perth Amboy near the Victory Bridge wasn't so good this time. I didn't see much happening the times I checked it. It's legal to fish for Stripers in the Ocean. Sand eels are bringing in the Bass to feed at Deal and Seaside Park. There were Winter Flounder caught at Shark River, but that too is now closed until March 1st. Party and charter boats fishing for Blackfish is fair. They are still catching them but there are fewer and fewer of them. Special offshore trips for Sea Bass are very good. Most anglers are catching their limit of 15 fish along with Ling, Porgies, a few Pollock and even Weakfish. A large 18 pound Blackfish was caught from a private charter out of Barnegat Inlet.

Fresh Water
It's the worst of both worlds at this time. The warm weather was good for Trout fishing, but the severe cold weather put a stop to it. Ice began to form in most upstate lakes but not solid enough to be safe. Two older men lost their lives at Split Rock Reservoir when they both tragically fell through the ice. Divers had to retrieve their bodies. Ice must be at least 6 inches or more to be safe. Right now, it is not safe. Please be sure ice is tested for its thickness before venturing out!
