Youngest Grand Knight Ever

South Amboy Knights of Columbus Council 426 has chosen 22 year old Jordan Drevelus to be Grand Knight for the 2022-23 Columbian year. Jordan is the youngest Grand Knight in the 123 year old history of the council. He will celebrate his 23rd birthday in August. Fred Whiteley previously was the youngest Grand Knight when he was 28 years old in 1999-2000. Jordan is gratified to be elected by his fellow Knights. "I think it's an honor and I'm humbled and privileged to be chosen." His goal for the next year is to make Columbian Star Council for the third straight year, continuing the trend begun by predecessor Gary Lattanzi. He said, "The title Knight is accurate since as soldiers for Christ, they stand for what's right in the world." Jordan added the Knights are a pillar in the community working with the Hibernians, American Legion, the fire department, and local churches. He said his grandfather was a Knight belonging to Msgr Carey Council 1280 in Carteret and was loved by the community. That helped spark his interest in the Knights. He is mourning the recent death of his father and said the constant support of his fellow Knights has shown him the true meaning of brotherhood. Jordan is a 2017 graduate of South Amboy High School and graduated Summa Cum Laude and was Valedictorian of his 2021 class at Seton Hall School of Theology in South Orange.

Veterans' Mural At Kennedy Park

Back in May of last year 2021, still in the Covid Pandemic, Michele Maher had learned that I was an art teacher in town where I grew up, and so reached out to me to see if I would be interested in doing a special mural military. I had never undertaken anything like this other than painting the murals inside of Cheesequake Elementary school when Sayreville took it over with the Project Before Preschool. Back then, Audrey Burns entrusted me with that project, again, one I had never done before, I just offered my time so when the kids came in person finally, they had a beautiful school to walk into.

Fast forward to this project, Michele was the one this time to believe in me. The initial sketch and painting I wasn't thrilled with but I think they understood where I might be going with it. Originally it would go under a train trestle, but that was never approved, and so when Michele messaged me about Kennedy Park, I immediately texted her (I almost dropped the phone) with a resounding YES!

The two very plain, very large walls that were to be considered are located at a great spot and easy to paint on, level for a lift, but sadly, hidden behind the skatepark. The moment I saw where it was, I said nope. for the Veterans, to show our support of our Can't have the Veterans' mural hidden. So that's when I saw the brick buildings. Very difficult and porous brick to paint,

especially to do a mural. But it reflected on the water, and that's all I needed visually to know it had to go there. Not to mention those walls are highly visible just driving by the park. I even asked on a Facebook Mural Artists group I belong to what muralists from all over the world thought of the location, and they all agreed with me. It had to be the brick wall.

This project physically began on April 30th, 2022, and without the help of Michele getting everything approved, Total Hardware for their unbelievable patience with me coming in and out with paint, getting the correct paint sprayer, etc, The buildings and

The Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine USS Alexandria (SSN 757) held a change of command ceremony aboard the ship at Naval Base Point Loma, June 8.

Cmdr. Christopher Rose, a South Amboy, N.J. native, relieved Cmdr. Christopher J. Carter as commanding officer. Cmdr. Rose graduated from St. Mary Elementary School in South Amboy, and also St. Joseph's of Metuchen High School.

Capt. Timothy Poe, Commander, Submarine Squadron 15, was the guest speaker at the ceremony, and Carter was presented with a Meritorious Service Medal.

"I cannot imagine a better leader to offset the challenging environment of the last three plus years," said Poe. "He led his team to the forefront of our naval efforts in the Pacific. Technical expertise aside, its Chris's genuine love for the crew that's unmatched. He truly embraces a people-first mentality. Chris, congratulations on a job well done, enjoy being back home in DC."

Under Carter's command, Alexandria successfully deployed twice to the Western Pacific. The ship completed an extended deployment last week to the U.S. 7th Fleet area of responsibility, where the crew executed the Chief of Naval Operations' maritime strategy in support of national security interests and maritime security operations.

The final election results for the South Amboy Primary Election have been submitted. In the Democratic Primary, Mayor Fred Henry had 567 votes, 60% over Councilman Brian McLaughlin 383 votes, 40%. In the Democrat Council At-Large race, Michael "Mickey" Gross-548 votes, 29%, and Anthony Conrad 499, 27% won over Councilwoman Christine Noble 442, 24%, and Mary Szaro 376, 20%.

grounds staff who also had so much patience keys to get in and out when I needed, Holt Machinery for donating 2 lifts to me to do the big parts of the project and now a smaller one for me to finally work by myself, I am forever grateful to everyone. This was not just a me project but a WE one. I am still tweaking things, adding some more lights, and putting details on, But for the most part, it IS finished.

The purpose of these murals is to remind everyone about this land we are privileged to stand on. What these men and women sacrificed for us, for the future of this great nation should NEVER EVER BE FORGOTTEN. Many people have forgotten. This mural is in no way a political stance at all either, I must add. It is a seriously humbling reminder of what we need to be grateful for. I heard at the fireworks by Elyse Barone that when she came into the park, she saw someone saluting the wall. That was all I needed to hear to know I had picked the right location for this. I hope all Veterans if they do not know this is here, at least find out it is, because I tell you what. I was never a very patriotic person.

But I cannot tell you how many times during this process tears streamed down my face as I painted those plaques, the POW MIA sign, and painted those stars and stripes, the face of the statue of liberty, and the boots, rifle and helmet, sitting alone on the hill right to the sunset. This project changed me, and resounded within me to be grateful for the freedoms we do have, and that we must stand tall and strong in the face of any adversity we may be met with

I honestly was only going to send some with me working the lift and giving me pictures and write to you and say, "Hey if you would like to see this mural, I think everyone should see it if they haven't". But I wear my heart on my sleeve, and well, my heart gets carried away sometimes. I hope this mural means something to many, it means

certain types of fires that are only common to these specific areas. Firefighters should train to be proficient in the types of fires they would be expected to respond to. In the middle of Nebraska, it would be unlikely to find a high-rise structure so firefighters would not normally train to fight a fire in one. But these firefighters would train to fight fires in a barn, silo, or fertilizer storage facility with a limited water supply. On the other hand, firefighters in urban areas with highrise structures train to fight fires in what is common to their location. It makes no sense to train for fires that would never occur in your response area. It is important to train and prepare for the typical routine fire that we normally respond to. These are the fires that we sometimes get complacent with and may be that one time where we get hurt. A type of fire that is prone to occur mostly in our western states is the wildland interface fire. These fires can devastate hundreds of thousands of acres of our natural forests and destroy all the structures in their way. A major cause of these fires is dry lightning which occurs without the rain. The best conditions for one of these wildland fires to occur is when the wooded area is dry, temperatures are high, humidity is low, and the winds are strong. A dry lightning strike may go unnoticed for some time, long enough for a fire to get hold. Once the fire gets a head start it becomes difficult to control, especially when it is in a remote area. It takes a while to deploy manpower and resources into these areas, especially if there are no available access roads. Some wildland fires have required thousands of firefighters to fight them. A fire under those conditions can easily exhaust fire crews and reduce the amount of time they can fight that fire. Such a fire occurred near Yarnell, Arizona, on June 28th, 2013, and was

Different areas of our country experience not declared 100% contained until July 10th. When fires of this magnitude occur, outside specialized firefighting teams respond and are called Hotshots or Smoke Jumpers. The Granite Mountain Hotshots from Prescott, Arizona responded to the Yarnell Hill Fire as it was named. Of the twenty Granite Mountain Hotshots that fought this fire, nineteen were killed by its deadly effects. This was the deadliest wildland fire for U.S. firefighters since 1933. The fire was reported at 5:36 pm on June 28th and was determined to be started from a lightning strike. On June 30th, fierce winds of 22 mph pushed the fire from three hundred acres to over two thousand acres. A long-term drought contributed to the fire's rapid spread as did temperatures of 1010 degrees. As the fire intensified, the Granite Mountain Hotshots were in the midst of this conflagration and became trapped by the intense heat and flames. Each firefighter was supplied with a single-person fire shelter made of aluminum and to be deployed when they are unable to escape the fire and heat. The shelter acts like a protective covering. The fire in this case was so intense that it over-ran the firefighters while they were inside their shelters. The lone survivor was the designated lookout but he too was threatened by the fire but was able to escape to safety. An investigation of the fire determined that the state fire officials knowingly put protection of property ahead of safety and should have pulled crews out of the area earlier. A reminder to all fire service leaders, at NO time should protection of property or the environment be placed before the lives of our firefighters, PERIOD! Locally in both the southern and northern sections of our state, fires of this nature do occur. The magnitude of the fire is determined by the conditions that occur in high heat, dryness, and lower humidity, typical July weather.



I was able to do some research and found that on January 3, 1968 Mayor Mrs. Mary (Peggy) Kerr, and Councilwomen Mrs. Dorothy Carter, Mrs. Florence Koval and Mrs. Dolores Zaccardi, who campaigned as the Democratic Distaff Slate, were sworn in by the City Clerk. Mayor Kerr became the first woman Mayor in Sayreville and the council would be split between the three returning male members and the three women listed above. The two photos are of the Mayor being sworn in with her sons in attendance. The second is of the four women before the election. The current Sayreville Mayor Victoria Kilpatrick was sworn in with Councilwomen Michele Cassidy Maher and Donna Roberts, and returning member Council President Mary Novak, so again there are four women in Sayreville government.





Elvis Tribute Artist Excels



Ten Years Ago From The Times Archives Whale In Bay Draws Many Spectators


a woman at Waterfront Park spotted a people came from all over to see if they could whale in the Raritan Bay, not far from the local beach. She reported the sighting, and members of the South Amboy and Sayreville Police Departments arrived at the scene, and immediately called the New Jersey Marine Mammal Stranding Center for assistance. According to Sayreville Police Officer Scott Poetsch, who was on duty, "It was a 20-24 foot juvenile Minke Whale and weighed about 2 tons." Members of the Stranding Center helped the animal which appeared uninjured, back out to sea around 2 p.m. As

On July 29, 2012 at about 10 a.m. news of the whale's visit traveled quickly, catch a glimpse of it, and TV crews were also on the scene. Curiosity seekers numbered over 1,000 throughout the day, with most standing along the rail near the park's track that overlooks the bay, and many took photos with their cell phones. Back in August of 2011 following the hurricane, a carcass of a whale was found on the beach, not far from this year's sighting. That sighting also drew at least 1,000 people who heard about it over the internet or on TV.





Prevent Childhood Drowning

Playing in the water at the beach or pool can be great fun for the summer, and drowning is the second leading cause of accidental death in children. What should parents always remember as they slide on those bathing suits and pack up the car?

1. Teach your child to swim!!

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that swimming lessons should be considered for children ages 1 to 3. Parents should decide about swimming lessons based on their child's physical abilities, emotional readiness, and closeness to water. Families with pools or who live near a lake should consider lessons at an earlier age.

2. Always supervise your child in the water.

Never even for a moment leave small children alone or under the supervision of another young child while in or near any kind of water. This includes bathtubs, toilets, buckets, or irrigation ditches. Keep a young child within arms reach when in the water. Even if you choose swimming areas with lifeguards, you still need to keep an eye on your kids. Lifeguards can't always watch every person at every moment.

3. Makesureyourpoolissurrounded by a fence.

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, a fence that completely surrounds a pool isolating it from the house can cut drowning risk by half. To really be safe, a fence should be at least 4 feet high, difficult to climb, and have a self latching lock closure. Building codes don't always require fencing around inflatable pools, but many of them contain thousands of gallons of water and stay up for weeks at a time.

4. Learn CPR.

All parents should know CPR. Starting CPR immediately can mean the difference between life and death, and can prevent severe brain damage. To find a class near you, contact the American Red Cross or speak with your local emergency first aid squads to see when they offer CPR classes.

5. Some other suggestions for parents.

Don't use air filled aids like water wings. Instead use lifejackets. They are designed to keep kids safe. All children should wear a lifejacket in a boat or at the water's edge. Know how deep the water is and what's underneath before letting kids jump in. Never let kids dive in until you know there's enough water, for example a pool should be at least 12 feet deep under the diving board. When at the ocean, teach kids what to do in a rip current. Swim parallel to the shore until you can get out of the current, then swim back to shore. Alcohol is a major risk factor when it comes to teen drowning. Talk to your kids about the dangers of drinking and swimming.

Salt Water

With hot weather here water temps have gone up. More semi tropical species have arrived. Spanish Mackerel are showing up in the surf and a few miles out. Large schools of Chub Mackerel are there with Bonito mixed in. Triggerfish are being caught from inshore rock piles and reefs. The Barnegat Inlet jetties have them too with some Sheepshead. The LBI surf is producing Bluefish, a few Striped Bass and many Kingfish. Some Sharks and Rays are out there, so you must be careful and watch your rod or you may lose it! Fluke fishing is good. There are still a lot of shorts but with the new liberal size limit you can expect more keepers. A Fluke of 12 pounds was caught off of Sandy Hook. Part boat Bluefish is hit and miss. Jigs and surface poppers work best now. Morning trips are best and boats fill out the day with Ling and Sea Bass with a 2 fish limit in summer only as it will go up later.

Fresh Water

We had more rain in early June so my Wife and I gave it another try in the lower Pequest in mid-June. Both of us caught our limit of 4 Trout and we had many hits and misses to keep us busy. Lakes and rivers are producing good fishing for Bass, Pickerel and Panfish. The Passaic River near Fairfield has Pike. Hybrid Striped Bass are possibly in Lake Hopatcong and Spruce Run Reservoir.





Summer Morgan Memories Cira 1910



Watson Coleman, and Kim Secure Superstorm Sandy Clawbacks Relief in Federal Spending Bill

Representatives Frank Pallone, Jr. (NJ-06), Bonnie Watson Coleman (NJ-12), and Andy Kim (NJ-03) announced that their provision to waive federal recoupment efforts for Superstorm Sandy victims passed the U.S. House of Representatives today. The provision is included in a federal spending bill and grants the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development the authority to waive the requirement for New Jersey homeowners to pay back federal disaster relief aid.

These recoupment efforts known as "clawbacks" have blindsided homeowners because many New Jersey residents applied for loans and benefits offered by various federal programs at the recommendation of the government. The spending bill would indefinitely delay the federal government's recoupments efforts - affecting 1,813 households in New Jersey that currently owe \$73 million. Among those homeowners, 882 households would be eligible for full

to Secretary approval.

"Superstorm Sandy decimated New Jersey families and towns, and they are still on the hook for millions of dollars through no fault of their own," Pallone said. "During this time of economic uncertainty, it's simply unfair for federal agencies to ask for repayment on tens of millions of dollars in loans and grants from Sandy. That's why I helped lead the fight to secure this important financial reprieve for our state. I want to thank my colleagues in the New Jersey delegation for their work for our state. I'm proud that we were able to secure this relief for our communities in the House-passed spending bill. I will continue fighting to make sure this crucial relief makes its way to the President's desk."

"A decade after Superstorm Sandy first are still burdened with the debt taken on to in my district that have been struggling for

After Hurricane Sandy, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development granted New Jersey \$230 million in federal funds for the Hudson River Flood-resilience project and \$150 million for the New Meadowlands Flood-resilience project. The two-year extension afforded the state the flexibility to put shovels in the ground and help New Jersey prepare for
