"Elaine Holton-Scott, 74, passed away on May 28. A South Amboy native who also lived in several other places throughout her life including, Parlin, California, Germany, Arkansas, Georgia, and finally back to Whiting, NJ for the last 3 years, prior to her death.



Elaine was a verv talented writer/ journalist and cook, and authored a cookbook, "You Can Do It" and also co-authored another one "Made In America" with her niece, Andrea Ploskonka. I hardly knew my firstcousin Elaine as a

kid, barely saying hello to her, even though she lived one street over in the Mechanicsville section of South Amboy. I was quite surprised when she started emailing me in 2005 from her home in Georgia, and asking me if she could write a column for my newspaper. Elaine certainly had fine credentials, having written for a local paper while living there, and I told her she was hired immediately. Getting her aboard The SA Times staff turned out to be a real blessing.

Most of her wonderful stories, featuring her vivid and exact memories of growing up in South Amboy in the 1950's and 60's, provided so much joy and happiness to many readers during her 17 years with The SA Times. People looked forward to reading her monthly feature, and going back in time to







Frank finished on the podium three times (top eight make the podium)- bronze medal in the medley relay, fourth in the free relay, eighth place in the 200 IM; and four other events in the top ten in the country.

In the past, Mark and Frank always talked about doing a running or triathlon race together, maybe in Colorado. Little did they know they would participate in the same National Senior Olympics-pretty good substitute. Good times!!

The terminal planned for South Amboy is intended to support direct water ferry service for passengers into New York City. The State has cumulatively appropriated approximately \$18 million for dredging and waterside construction including bulkheads, pilings, the floating dock, and more.

"The completion of this facility is the keystone to all that we have built or will build on the waterfront," said South Amboy Mayor Fred Henry. "It will result in an unprecedented level of transportation alternatives and open up another large segment of our waterfront for public access and enjoyment."

The city of South Amboy was awarded a \$5.3 million federal grant for the project, distributed through the U.S. Department of Transportation's Passenger Ferry Grant program. Part of a larger vision to create an intermodal transit village, the ferry service will combine strategically with the local train to improve city and regional mobility.

"I'm proud to join state and local leaders in South Amboy today to mark this important moment in the ferry terminal project," said Congressman Frank Pallone. "The South Amboy ferry will give residents a new way to commute between Central Jersey and New York City and reduce traffic congestion. The new facility will also bolster economic opportunities in the city and surrounding area. I'm glad the federal funding I helped secure for the project will be put to work soon, and I want to thank everyone who joined us today for their dedication and support of this important project."

several months of progress in city efforts to secure funds, receive appropriate development permits from the Department of Environmental Protection and U.S Army Corps of Engineers, and begin procurement of contracting bids and solicitation of requests for proposals.

"The ferry service is the lynchpin to the ongoing renaissance taking place in South Amboy, as investors are investing millions of dollars to reshape the waterfront," said

Senator Joe Vitale (D-Middlesex). "We are consistently learning of new opportunities being created in South Amboy, as developers share their vision for the city's consideration. It is an exciting time to be part of this community, as we work with local officials to carefully navigate the best path forward for South Amboy. This grant is evidence that federal officials also see the enormous opportunity to create what will certainly become one of the top transit villages in the state. None of this could be achieved without vision and planning for the ferry and I applaud South Amboy for this landmark achievement."

"South Amboy's future Ferry service will cement the city's role as one of Middlesex County's most important transportation hubs," said Assemblywoman Yvonne Lopez (D-Middlesex). "Offering direct service to New York City for commuters and visitors alike, the ferry will not only provide an efficient commuting option but will also provide a substantial boost to South Amboy's local economy. Projects like these have generational impacts and I am proud of South Amboy's diligence and tenacity towards ensuring this project's beginning and ultimate completion."

Altogether, the \$22.3 million will fund every aspect of the project except for the ferry terminal building. An expanded waterfront plaza and walkway are all part of funded project plans.

"A project of this magnitude and impact does not come together overnight; The press conference followed it is the result of hard work, planning, and dedication," said Middlesex County Commissioner Director Ronald G. Rios. "Today's groundbreaking is the culmination of years of effort on the part of South Amboy Mayor Fred Henry and the City Council. Of course, this project would not be possible without the critical funding secured by the 19th District Legislative team of Speaker Coughlin, Senator Vitale, and Assemblywoman Lopez."



on one of the most disastrous passenger ship fires in our country's history aboard the Passenger Ship (PS) General Slocum, a sidewheel steamboat, built in Brooklyn, New York in 1891. This ship had a history of mishaps from its beginning which included multiple groundings and collisions. The steamboat was named for Civil War General Henry Warner Slocum. The ship operated in the harbors of New York as an excursion steamer throughout its short life. This was anything but a small ship because in 1894, while returning from an excursion, it ran aground on a sandbar with 4700 passengers on board. The groundings and collisions were minor in comparison to the disaster that occurred aboard the ship on Wednesday, June 15th, 1904. On this date, the St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church located in Manhattan, had chartered the PS General Slocum for a price of \$350.00. The ship was to take the passengers up the East River and then eastward across the Long Island Sound to Locust Grove which was a picnic site on Long Island. The excursion was an annual rite for the German church group, having done this trip for seventeen consecutive years. There were 1400 passengers on board at the time, mostly women and children. The ship had gotten underway at approximately 9:30am from the Third Street pier. As it passed East 90th Street, a fire started in a forward cabin, the third compartment aft of the bow of the ship and just under the main deck. The cause of the fire was most likely due to a discarded cigarette or match. The fire intensified quickly due to the accumulation of straw, oily rags, and lamp oil located around the room, a disaster waiting to happen. The fire was first noticed at 10:00am with eyewitnesses reporting fire in various locations? Could this fire have been intentionally set? Passengers were aware of the fire below decks. When the ship's Captain Van Schaick was made aware of the fire, he ordered the ship to proceed full speed ahead and to beach the ship on North Brother Island. The crew attempted

This month in fire history we reflect to suppress the fire but to no avail due to the "cheap unlined linen" hose that was rotten and burst when filled with water. The crew had never practiced firefighting drills in the past. The Captain sailed into the headwinds which only fanned and intensified the fire. He then ordered the ship to stay on course and not run the ship aground at that time. These actions had a direct result on the lives lost. Within ten minutes of the ship finally being beached, the fire engulfed the entire vessel which was only twenty minutes after the fire was first reported. When the ship beached, the bow section rested in shallow waters but the aft section was in very deep water. The heavy fire caused the starboard section hurricane deck to collapse causing the deaths of up to five hundred passengers. An estimated 400-600 people drowned as they jumped from the aft section into the deep water. Those that jumped from the bow section landed in shallow water and most survived. The final death toll of this incident was 950 people and another 175 injured. The General Slocum was salvaged and converted into a 625-gross barge and renamed Maryland. Unfortunately, this vessel continued to be cursed as it sank in 1909, refloated and then again sank in the Atlantic Ocean off the New Jersey coast near Sea Isle City on December 4th, 1911, during a storm while carrying a cargo of coal.

After the first few articles it became easier and easier to gather the information and facts for each article and make them interesting and informative to you. Encouragement from my fellow staff writers helped immensely. My goal, in writing these articles, is to keep our firefighters safe in everything they do and to return home after every fire. I also want to keep the community informed on how to prevent fires but what to do if one does occur. Looking forward to the next 100 "Smoke Columns".



Summertime Pool Fun

More and more homes now have swimming pools. Even those people who don't have pools, at least have access to good places for their families to swim.

With classes from the American Red Cross, schools, community programs and other sources, all children should be taught the fun of swimming – and swimming safely.

Besides learning to swim, there are some basic rules for both swimmers and home pool owners. Here are a few of them:

- DO NOT allow "clowning around" in or near the pool.
- Teach children water games for friendly competitions to avoid poolside behavior such as pushing, running, dunking or performing stunts.
- Teach children to be especially careful on water slides.
- Be sure an adult is present any time children are swimming.
- Know for sure that the water is deep enough before diving in.
- Flotation devices are fine, but do not depend on them absolutely.
- Keep electrically operated radios, tape players or other equipment away from the pool.
- Serve cold drinks in plastic or disposable, unbreakable containers.
- Keep rescue equipment close to the pool and in good condition.
- Make sure your pool is fenced on all sides.
- Don't stay in the water too long. Keep in mind that the glare/ reflection of the sun on the water can produce a severe burn even after a very short time.
- Always be alert. Don't overestimate your abilities on those of children in your care. Play it safe.

Have fun in your pool or other swimming areas. Make sure each family member learns the rules so that they become second nature.

Then, relax and enjoy swimming, one of the best and most popular summertime activities.







continued from Page 1 how things used to be many years ago. Elaine learned to slow down...Recently painted her office and did some flower work detail...She


probably had the most photographic/detailed memory of anyone I have ever known. For example, she would tell you the exact

Speaker Coughlin Bipartisan Bill to Improve Real-Time Vote Count Reporting in NJ Elections Clears Assembly Measure Also to Address Ballot Pick-Up and Voter Disenfranchisement, and Advances Alongside Election Transparency Package

As New Jersey has expanded ways to cast your ballot, people are more empowered to be processed, but not counted, beginning than ever to exercise their right to vote. To continue shaping the state's pro-democracy election infrastructure, the full Assembly voted 78-0-2 passing legislation (A-3822) on Thursday as part of a larger bipartisan election reform push aiming to boost voting transparency, security, and participation.

"At a critical and harshly partisan time n our country, as others have moved to make it harder not easier to vote and the federal government has often been unable to act decisively, I think we can be exceptionally proud to boast that New Jersey is bucking the trend," said Assembly Speaker Craig J. Coughlin (D-Middlesex). The bipartisan legislation sponsored by Coughlin and Assembly members John DiMaio, Sterley Stanley, Aura Dunn, and Joe Danielsen would require county Board of Elections websites to uniformly report unofficial results on election night. Voters would be able to see the number of votes cast, counted, and remaining to be counted broken down by how a ballot was cast whether by machine during early voting or on Election Day, by mail, or provisionally. to New Jerseyans: Your elections are fair, your elections are open, and both parties are still able to work together to protect the right to vote," said Coughlin addressing the Assembly chambers in advance of a floor vote on his legislation and other election reform measures.

The bill would also enable mail-in ballots five days before an election in order for the unofficial results of both in-person and bymail votes to be reported together as soon after the close of polls as possible. Processing ballots involves the verifying voter signatures and the physical opening and preparation of ballots for tabulation.

"At the heart of our bipartisan bill package, we are working to maintain citizens' trust and confidence in our election outcomes. My bill specifically looks to do that by catching up the way we process, count, and report ballots, which in turn ensures the public are seeing real-time results reflective of all votes cast whether early, by mail, or at the polls on Election Day," said Coughlin. Currently, election officials must retrieve ballots from drop boxes every day, which in some communities is unnecessary and puts a strain on limited resources. To resolve this time-consuming and potentially costly requirement, the bill would additionally enable county elections officials to establish a pickup schedule to which officials from both parties agree. Finally, addressing an issue arising "Here's the message we are sending from a processing glitch that unintentionally disenfranchised tens of thousands of voters in primaries, the bill would remove the ability to change your party affiliation at the Motor Vehicle Commission.


