Robert "Bob" Noble Jr., 56, of South Amboy died on November 1. He was a very well-liked and highly-respected man, locally, on the job, and in the many organizations he was so actively involved with.

Bob was a New Jersey Transit Policeman in Newark, and a founding member of the Office of Emergency Management for NJ Transit Police. He also went on to become an instructor at TEEX at Texas A&M, served on USAR State Task Force, and also served as State Delegate for the PBA, and then the FOP. In addition, he was Captain of the Protection Fire Company in 1994.

People came from all over the state and different organizations to The Gundrum Service "Home for Funerals" in South Amboy to pay their final respects and mourn Bob, who was so loved by family, friends, coworkers and countless others. Bob's funeral was without a doubt one of the largest ever in the history of South Amboy. It was a beautiful and fitting farewell to a wonderful man, who touched so many lives in a positive way during his brief time on earth.

Free local shuttles run between Sayreville and South Amboy and the ferry landing at 100 Radford Ferry Road in South Amboy. "This is a great day for all involved." said Fred A. Henry, Mayor of The City of South Amboy. "I would especially like to thank NY Waterway for their cooperation in getting this temporary site opened and beginning business. This is something that we have waited quite some time for, and I am very excited about the ceremonial launch on October 30th."

Sayreville GOP Sweeps Election

Sayreville Republicans to a clean sweep in the Dwumfour on the council through the end Nov. 7th election. O'Brien will once again become the Borough's Mayor by virtue of his 5,069 votes which defeated Democratic challenger Bill Henry, who received 3,292. The Republicans also captured two-3 year seats on the Council. Former Police Chief John Zebrowski topped the four candidates with 4,851 votes, while his running mate, Michael Colaci notched 4,610. Longtime Councilwoman Mary Novak tallied 3,504 votes, and Vincent Conti 3,354. Zebrowski



Clean PPE after every fire because PFAS can degrade the material over time and give off the dust that measure the PFAS levels in your body. The IAFF is recommending to its members that they reduce the amount of time they actually wear their PPE and to remove it, if possible, when not actually engaged in fighting fires. For many of us this is going against the grain of our training. Our PPE is our outer layer of states have filed class action lawsuits for work-related illnesses that could be caused by wearing PFAS saturated clothing. Keep an open mind and think of the changes you can make when wearing your PPE.





about the Polka started stirring my memory of the music I love and was part of my life quite a number of years ago.

I just returned from my Army stint in Korea in February of 1955. With my mustering out pay I bought a brand new 1955 Chevy Belair HardTop for \$2000. The colors were turquoise and cream. It got me around to the dances.

After getting my civilian feet back on United States soil, I met some people who turned me on going to dances where, of course, they were playing Polka music. I started out with two left feet but with a little time those two left feet almost turned into Fred Astaire Polka stompers.

My love of the Polka, I think, was a recollection, when I was in Grammar School, of all the people dancing at the Sacred Heart "Paczkovy Ball" where they served Paczki pronounced like punch-kee. It was held every year around lent with those delicious donuts and of course coffee. But I digress.

While at one of the Polka dances I spied this beautiful lady who floated around like Ginger Rogers on the dance floor. Some of the people reading my analogy to the two dancing stars may be too young to remember both of them.

I made it a goal to make sure the next time I was at a Polka dance and she was there, I was going to meet her. Fast forward a week or so. We are at Rahway Gardens in Rahway, could have been called Rahway Beer Gardens, not sure.

This beautiful lady was there. Got my nerve up and asked her to dance. Her name was Charlotte Marie Marklin from Perth Amboy. The rest is history, married, and two children. But not before we polkaed our way around the area for a few years dancing to all the Polka song renditions, waltzes and of course the Oberek. The Oberek is a dance somewhere between the Polka and the Waltz.

ask? Well one was the Rahway Gardens that many years.

A couple of recent articles in the paper I just mentioned. Another place where they almost had a band playing every week was the Liberty Ballroom in South River.

> Bands like Frank Wojnarowski, Bernie Witkowski and The Connecticut Twins. The Connecticut twins were Stanley and John (Stas and Jas) Przasnyski. There of course were other local people with smaller groups that would play, particularly for weddings

> The three groups mentioned are now in the International Polka Association (IPA) Polka Hall of Fame, in Chicago.

> Bernie (he also used the last name of White) played the clarinet and also sax, accordion, flute, drum and organ. But the clarinet was always the instrument that was prevalent in his band and it put you in the mood to do the Polka.

> Frank was a violinist and his role was as a band leader. As I recall his orchestra was large than 10

> Stanley (Stas) played the accordion and John (Jas) played the drums. They had a smaller group usually consisting of only 6 members while other bands were at least 10 or more. The twins relied on the clarinet and trumpet as their lead which made their polkas fast and easier to dance to.

> Polkas were sometimes classified by the way they were played and the step you used. In New Jersey we did have the Eastern style Polka bands. We also danced a certain way in some cases and we called it the Jersey City Step. But please don't ask me to do it today.

> Other places were the Polish Falcon Camp, Somerville. We traveled to the Garfield area for dances. It was almost every week and we would dance every dance for about a 3 hour session. That was our cardio exercise for the week. It was great.

> We loved it. I wish I could do the Polka again, but my Fred Alistair legs have gone by the wayside. Although, my memory reminisces about those wonderful days.
