

American Legion Post Razed By Tom Burkard

of the American Legion Luke A. Lovely Post #62 of South Amboy, as they watched the demolition of the building that was their headquarters since 1921, when the house on lower David Street was given to them from a Mr. Izenberg. The hall was used for meetings and various social events through the years, such as small weddings, confirmations, and even a sports collectors show. The structure was battered beyond repair during the flooding and devastation of Superstorm Sandy on October 29, 2012.

According to longtime Commander Bob "Zak" Sekerak, "We thought we would be reopening and running things by 2015, but because of rules and regulations, we weren't able to." After Sandy hit, the Legion needed a place to meet, and the South Amboy Elks welcomed them for $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, and after that, they held meetings at the AOH building in South Amboy.

Commander Sekerak sent out special thanks to Past State Commander of the American Legion, Dan Dunn from Woodbridge, who, before COVID, approached Post #62 with an idea for a new Legion with veterans apartments. Two months later, Sekerak talked for over an hour

It was a bittersweet time for members with Jim Scanlon from Gloucester County, who was also helpful. "In addition, Mickey Gross was a big help with two golf outings, and also Mayor Fred Henry and South Amboy Business Administrator Glenn Skarzynski were helpful," stated Sekerak. The new Legion building and veterans apartments will be paid for by grants and fundraisers.

> Standing by the site of the American Legion building and watching as it was razed, veterans undoubtedly had many fond memories of days gone by. Commander Sekerak, now in his 18th year in the top spot, said that I'm looking forward to the construction of the new building, which will feature 10 veterans apartments, plus the American Legion. It's time to go out with the old and in with the new."

> The new American Legion with veterans apartments, will be expanded from the previous size to the corner of Rosewell St. Sekerak stated, "We are all looking forward to the new Legion and getting new and younger people to join and keep the Legion going." There are currently 60 members, and according to the Commander, the Legion's membership peaked at about 165 back in 1984, when an influx of VietNam veterans started joining.



Paul Weiss and ErnestAdell were co-captains of the wrestling team. 1962 marked the final year of basketball in the old school gym, and the boys' team had a rough (4-17) record. Mary Jane Olsen and Nancy Plewa were co-captains of the cheerleaders. Theresa Check was Majorette. On Graduation Day, "I Can't Stop Loving You" by Ray Charles was the #1 song in the land. There were 155 graduates, and Delia Jones was Valedictorian, Mary Romanski the Salutatorian and Peter P. O'Such Jr., Terterian. a fine all-around group of young adults.

one of the most destructive forces that is not publicly discussed. One of the biggest failures in the volunteer fire service is the failure to address fire station drama. Studies have shown that slightly less than 40% of volunteer firefighters are satisfied with the atmosphere in their fire stations. Unfortunately, there are fire officers that fail to address drama or even condone or participate in the drama. For fire departments to be successful, it is critical that senior leadership create a culture where the fire station drama is not tolerated. In many cases this is easier said than done. In the fire service no one works alone, we work as a team and drama will cause that team mentality to disintegrate. So, what type of drama is occurring that needs addressing?

Drama comes in a variety of forms, some of which are: gossiping, spreading rumors, negativity, rudeness, passive aggressive actions, discrediting other firefighters, excluding others, inconsistent disciplinary actions, leaders taking sides, and favoritism. Each of these actions, or lack thereof, is a basis for drama. In the volunteer fire service, we have a challenging time recruiting new members and retaining those we already have. New recruits are not breaking down our doors to become firefighters as they did back in the 50's, 60's and 70's. How many new firefighters resign before they even get their feet wet due to the drama? Think about how many of your dedicated long-time firefighters quit the department because of the drama or the social media comments. With that said, how do we move forward and change that culture? The change must come from the top leadership positions and filter down through the company officers to the firefighters. Our officers must lead by example. When our fire service leaders stand-up and stop the drama in its tracks, then and only then, will all make it a true "Brotherhood."

Drama in the volunteer fire service is it create a better working atmosphere in the fire service for all involved. Spreading rumors only adds to gossiping which over time becomes detrimental to the department. The fear of becoming a target of gossip will keep a firefighter silent. Continuously failing to include a member in company events will make them feel unimportant and lead to reasons for quitting. Remember, we are a team and we work TOGETHER! Leaders cannot engage in workplace drama, PERIOD! Fire officers cannot take sides based on someone liking or disliking another member. Discipline cannot be delved out harsher to someone who is disliked, and less harsh or not at all to a friend. Treat everyone equally because if a member observes someone being treated favorably/unfavorably, it only tends to undermine the entire organization and the possibility of legal action against the organization. We must encourage volunteers to be transparent with leadership about issues occurring in the fire station or at the scene of an incident. Members should be able to discuss issues with their leaders without the fear of retaliation. If someone performed an inappropriate act at a fire scene, he should be able to discuss it freely with his officers and not be bashed or criticized for his actions, otherwise it may lead to more drama. Most times it is better to discuss corrective actions in a private setting rather than in public which may cause embarrassment to the individual in question.

> With social media being so prevalent in our daily lives it becomes easy for drama to run rampant through the community. Stop the firehouse drama and stop it now before something serious occurs because of it. Make your fire station a true fire "house" where we are all family. We all mention the "Brotherhood" in the fire service, then let us

Salt Water

Fluke and some good-sized ones bit quite well into the last day of the season September 27th. Party boats now must turn to bottom fishing for Porgies and Sea Bass when the season opens October 7th. That fishing has been good. Raritan Bay Shore fishing off our local beaches is still slow. I checked out Barnegat Inlet fishing off local docks nearby. All I caught was a handful of little Sea Bass and Black fish, not bigger than my hand. I did not observe anyone else with anything worth keeping. Surf fishing at LBI, up until the remnants of hurricane Ian, was small Bluefish and Kingfish. I tried it myselfmd-week the last week of September. It was a nice day, but I didn't set the world on fire and neither did the anglers nearby. I caught one Clear Nose Skate, 2 very small Kingfish and one Snapper size Bluefish and missed a few bites. Party boats that were out after Bluefish were doing well with bigger sizes 5 to 8 pounds, all on jigs, a few Bonito and False Albacore mixed in the catch. The remnants of hurricane Ian has churned up the ocean putting a damper on fishing. Wait until things settle down before venturing out to sea or your favorite surf. **Fresh Water**

The hot weather was bad enough, but the recent storms raised water levels to flood stage. Wait at least a week for water levels to go down. Fall Trout stocking will start on Columbus Day October 10th and continue into the following week. Large Trout from 14 to 24 inches will be stocked. Prior to the storms, Lake Hopatcong was producing hybrid Striped Bass and Catfish. Overall fishing should improve near the end of the month


