NJ 101.5's Bill Spadea Honors Off-Duty Cop

New Jersey 101.5 FM morning host Bill Spadea recently honored an off duty officer who rescued a man on the Route 9 bridge linking Sayreville with Perth Amboy. On his March 12 Blue Friday segment, Spadea said off duty New Jersey Correctional Officer Faustino Saucedo of Perth Amboy is a hero because officers are always on duty even when they hang up their uniform after a shift. He said Officer Saucedo was on his way to Carteret to pick up his wife when he noticed a man at the side of the Route 9 bridge. He quickly pulled over and his quick decision was the difference between life and death. He noted Saucedo grabbed the man's arms preventing him from falling and held him long enough so bystanders could pull him to safety. He added Saucedo is a shining example of the heroism seen every day from our local law officers. Every Friday Spadea holds the Blue Friday segment honoring police officers.

Remembering Mark Bratus

On March 7, 2021 South Amboy's storied sports history lost one of the contributors to that history - Mark Bratus. Mark and I were classmates and teammates in grammar school, high school and college. In the 1960s St Mary's Grammar School only had an 8th grade team. Mark was precocious with his ability on the court, and he was the first 6th grader in school history to make the 8th grade team.

The overflow crowds at Monsignor Sullivan Gymnasium were a true testament to the support that the town of South Amboy gave the 1968-1969 St Mary's team. We went 21-4, and were undefeated at home! Mark was a true leader of that team, and was the prototypical NJ Catholic School point guard: heady, great ball handler, tough defensively, and a reliable scorer. Mark was selected to the All-County Third Team. Much to our chagrin we lost in Atlantic City in the State Tournament (still stings to this day!).

We both then received basketball

scholarships to play at Biscayne College, Miami Florida. Here are just a few quotes from the team's Basketball Guide describing Mark's play: "heady backcourt general... excellent defensively...best guard handling pressure defenses...adept at finding the open man". Some highlights of Mark's college career were playing in the NCAA DII Tournament in 1972, and playing against two NCAA DI Final Four teams - Jacksonville University (Artis Gilmore) in 1970 and Florida State in 1972.

Aside from his achievements on the court, Mark was known for his great personality. He was unassuming, humble, well-respected, very likable, all with his laid back demeanor.

We're always going to have great memories of Mark to hold in our hearts. Great classmate...Excellent teammate... Better friend! We're all going to miss you Mark! May you Rest In Peace!

South Amboy, Sayreville To Get Stimulus Share

New Jersey Senators Bob Menendez and Cory Booker said that our state will receive the 8th largest share, nearly \$10.2 billion of the \$350 billion for local governments in the American Rescue Plan Act that President Joe Biden signed on March 11.

The Borough of Sayreville will receive \$5,520,940.84, and the City of South Amboy will get \$901,378.78. The funding will help pay for COVID-19 expenses, aid residents and local businesses and other uses.

Yearbook-Hoffman 1991

During the first week of school in September 1990, the local band, Bon Jovi was topping the national music charts with "Blaze of Glory," and Hoffman High's Class of '91 was gearing up for its big final year of high school glory. William Beattie was school principal, and some of his talented faculty consisted of: John Bernosky, Mrs. Rim, Mrs. Inman, Richard Gore, and Miss Folis. Mrs. Donnelly was the School Nurse. The yearbook, titled "Endnotes," was dedicated to Rich Klein and Joe Miceli. Tangereen Kraus and Nancy Van Reed were Editors-In-Chief of the yearbook. Senior Class officers were: President-Jim Hoehman; VP-Tangereen Kraus; Secretary-Stacey White; Treasurer-Ken Krass. Gary Kuhn was President of the National Honor Society. Spirit Week was held Dec. 17-22, 1990, and everyone had a blast. The week featured Toga Day, Purple & Gold Day, and other great activities. The Mr. Hoffman contest was held on Feb. 28, 1991, and Ryan Tooker was the winner. HGHHS also offered many clubs and organizations such as the Ski Club, Peer Leadership, Newspaper, Lighting Club, Band, Prom Committee, National Honor Society, Ecology Club, Decathlon of Knowledge, Math Contest, Literary Magazine, Chorus,

History Club, SADD. Some of the 42 seniors randomly selected include: Stephen Ala, Belinda Baran, Debra Barnes, Charles Brinkerhoff, Cheryl Cieslarczyk, Marco Cavallo, Tracy Darabos, Christine Forrer, Maria Gaito, Carolyn Guikoff, Jason Ingstrup, Gustave Kaiser, Jamie Lynn Kane, Michele Lang, Mary Malinowski, Deborah McCloud, Sherilyn Milochik, Scott Murphy, Cherice Read, Tracy Parfianowicz, Donald Roberts, Robert Stegway, Maria Skrzyniarz, Tara Tingle, John Wranovics. In early '91, the U.S. was involved in Desert Storm, and patriotism was at a high level everywhere, including Hoffman HS. Top notch senior athletes included: Erin Arnold, Robert DeLude, Bobbie-Jo Hermes, Melissa Herrick, Jim Hoehman, Richard Hulsart, James Keegan, Colleen Kozak, Anthony Kosmoski, Kenneth Krass. Gary Kuhn, (who scored over 1,000 points in his basketball career, captured the Middlesex County scoring title), Ronald Andrew Sabine, Allison Stickle, Stacey White. Mariah Carey's "I Don't Wanna Cry" was the #1 hit in the nation as Hoffman High's Class of 1991 attended its commencement exercises. HGHHS Class of '91 was a fine and dedicated group, with very bright futures ahead.

South Amboy, NJ – The Sadie Pope Dowdell Library has been serving the South Amboy community for more than 107 years and is proud to serve as a destination for the community. Whether offering entertaining cultural and educational programs - in-house, or virtually, there has always been something for everyone. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the library briefly closed and reopened at Governor Murphy's edict, following CDC protocols. The library initially offered contactless service - then quickly pivoted and expanded services by opening the building, even though libraries of similar size only offered curbside service – and still do! Keeping staff and the community healthy was a priority, so social distancing protocols, personal protective equipment, Plexiglas shields, and additional cleaning was initiated. Dedicated staff also attended training webinars, communicated via Zoom meetings, presented virtual programming, and conducted business remotely. An eNewsletter and social media posts kept the community up to date on library services, small business grant opportunities and pandemic updates.

The demand for remote services increased, as many worked or studied at home, limiting their exposure to others due to the pandemic. To continue to serve the community, the library adjusted the dial and began offering virtual programming such as Test Kitchen, technology tips, Storytime, and art exhibitions through the YouTube Channel. Take-home kits from Sadie's Studio were offered. An outdoor "drive-in" music program was held featuring the Paul Nagy Project. It was a robust mix of virtual and in-person programming – a library without walls.

The Dowdell Library also increased digital content to include more downloadable eBooks, eAudio books, current magazines and music and streaming movies. Wi-Fi was available 24/7 whether used inside or

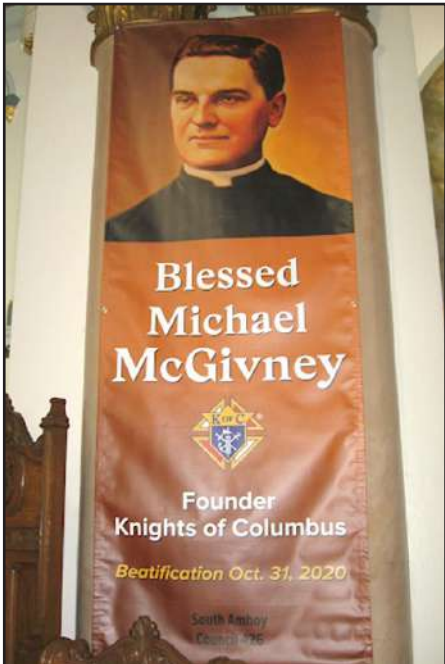
outside the building. JerseyClicks provided 24/7 accurate and timely information services from dowdell.org. The online BrainFuse program offered live tutoring, GED, SAT and citizenship test prep assistance, financial assistance tips for college applicants, career resources, etc.

Other library services included having public computers available (sanitized between uses); free library cards, faxing, printing, notary services, tax preparation assistance, home delivery for our elderly population, and a cooperative membership in the regional LMxAC Consortium.

The Dowdell Library was awarded one of the Best of the Best libraries in Middlesex County last year due to their service oriented staff and devoted Library Board. So, drop in or visit dowdell.org to make use of the above free services. The magic of your library is awaiting!

In The Beginning...

Everything has a beginning...even the Old Testament starts with the words, "In the beginning," in the Book of Genesis. Whether it's the world, religion, life, civilizations, the SATimes, or the food items found in our kitchen cabinets, everything has a beginning. So, let's just take a look at a few of those familiar food products which we all have eaten one time or another in our lives:

*Ritz Crackers: In 1934, in competition with Sunshine Biscuits, the National Biscuit Company, later to be known as Nabisco, began selling their new Ritz Crackers. In 1935, during the Depression, 5 billion boxes had been sold for 19 cents per box. In just 3 years, Ritz Crackers became the best-selling cracker in America. Well-known for their Mock Apple Pie recipe makes many people believe this recipe had started with Ritz Crackers, but that's not true. Housewives had been making a mock apple cracker pie since the mid-1800s, if not even sooner.

*Pop Tarts: Post had a great idea back in early 1963 which would keep food items with a cake texture and have a long shelf life. Unfortunately, Kellogg heard about it and almost in a flash, the Kellogg Pop-Tarts were being made and marketed. That was in 1964. Sold as a breakfast item, sugary sweet, fruit-filled Pop-Tarts could be described as flat cakes or flat cookies. Although there has long been a push for healthy eating, Kellogg's Pop-Tarts are still just as popular now as they had been 57 years ago.

*Spam: There are usually a lot of snickers when Spam is mentioned in a conversation... but that's by the "ignorant masses" who have never tasted it. We, who have eaten this somewhat unidentifiable meat, which happens to be pork, aren't ashamed to tell anyone that it actually is very good, especially when eaten fried with sunny side up eggs. Spam made its debut on July 5, 1937, and ended up in G.I. rations during WWII and the Korean War. To help with food shortages, our government supplied the people in the Philippines and Hawaii with enough cans

to feed them through the war. To this day, Spam is Hawaii's favorite food, while in the Philippines, it's considered a Cultural symbol.

*Heinz Ketchup: When you think of ketchup, Heinz usually comes to mind, although the "57 varieties" continues to be marketing "baloney." Terri Heinz Kerry, wife of the politician John Kerry, had inherited the Heinz fortune upon the death of Senator John Heinz, whose grandfather had started making and selling ketchup in 1876. In 1907 alone, Heinz sold 13 million bottles of his ketchup. Terri Kerry is worth an estimated \$1,000,000,000 (yes, 1 billion dollars).

*Stove Top Stuffing: Kraft began marketing Stove Top Stuffing in 1972, selling 60 million boxes the very first year. Women who couldn't cook; women who didn't want to cook; and women who had little time to cook treated this "belly filler" as though it were "the best thing since sliced bread," as that old saying goes. Many still do.

*Sliced bread: The first loaf of wrapped, machinery sliced bread was sold in 1928. It was advertised as being, "The greatest forward step in the baking industry since bread was wrapped."

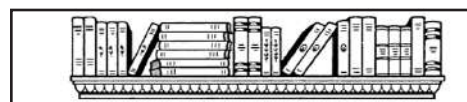
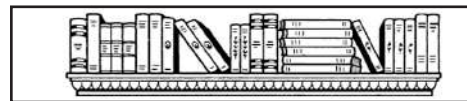

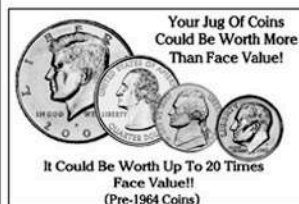

The Smoke Column

The Dangers of Car Fires Part 2

In part 1 on car fires we discussed some of the dangers associated with bumpers, pistons, struts, and the polyurethane foams used in the manufacturing of the new vehicles. Part 2 will investigate the hidden dangers that we must be aware of each time we respond to a vehicle fire. Responding to a Volkswagen fire in the 1960's was a rude awakening for many firefighters. Attacking a Volkswagen fire in the same manner as any other vehicle fire could be disastrous because the Volkswagen engines were made from Magnesium. Applying water to a burning Magnesium fire will cause a violent explosive reaction. In recent years we have seen this type of exotic metals used in different vehicle parts that we would never have thought of in past years. We have all heard of "MAG WHEELS" which are expensive Magnesium rims used on sporty cars. Today Magnesium can be found in the powertrain, suspension, chassis, steering wheel armatures and brackets, gear boxes, clutch housings, and oil pans. Burning Magnesium is easy to spot because it will burn with a brilliant white glow. To extinguish this fire, it may be necessary to extinguish the burning material surrounding the Magnesium first which may result in a cooling effect on the Magnesium. A Class D extinguisher may be necessary to completely douse the burning metal.

Air bags pose another hidden hazard as they can be located anywhere throughout the vehicle's interior. Their inflator devices can activate in 0.03 seconds by the high temperatures of a fire. There is NO advanced warning and NO time to react! Victims pinned inside vehicles can be seriously injured by an inadvertent exploding airbag as well as firefighters attempting to rescue them.

Many buses and trucks are now being powered by Compressed Natural Gas (CNG). These vehicles have pressurized cylinders containing natural gas which when ruptured or involved in fire becomes extremely



dangerous. The cylinder can rupture and fly through the air with great speed causing severe damage. Sometimes it may be wiser not to approach a burning CNG vehicle fire and rather let it burn itself out.

We are constantly being bombarded with advertisements for all electric or hybrid vehicles which will someday in the future replace combustible engines for good. These vehicles are powered by batteries or a combination of batteries and gasoline. Fighting a fire in a vehicle powered by batteries has two dangers that we must be concerned with. First is the material itself that is burning and must be extinguished. The second danger is in the electrical wiring and the high voltage generated by the batteries in the vehicle. Under fire conditions it may not be so easily identified. These high voltages can KILL!

So, what do we want to take away from these car fire articles? When responding to a vehicle fire be prepared for the unexpected. Identify as much of the vehicle and its make and model as possible. This may give you the answer as to how the vehicle is powered which will determine how you fight this fire. Has the vehicle been modified with after-market parts or specialty products? Does it look like the common family SUV or can it be carrying some types of hazard material or illegal items? Recognize and familiarize yourself to what you may expect on your next alarm BEFORE the next alarm. And ALWAYS, ALWAYS, ALWAYS wear all your PPE as it was designed to be worn. This may be the most important step that will save your life.

Middlesex College Joins Campuses Nationwide in Effort to be "Voter Friendly"

Middlesex College is one of more than 200 colleges and universities in 37 states and the District of Columbia designated as a "Voter Friendly Campus." The initiative, led by national nonpartisan organizations Fair Elections Center's Campus Vote Project (CVP) and NASPA – Student

Affairs Administrators in Higher Education, held participating institutions accountable for planning and implementing practices that encourage their students to register and vote in the 2020 election and in coming years.

The mission of the Voter Friendly Campus designation is to bolster efforts that help students overcome barriers to participating in the political process. Middlesex College was evaluated based on a campus plan about how it could register, educate, and turn out student voters in 2020, how it facilitated voter engagement efforts on campus, and a final analysis of its efforts – all in the face of the upheaval caused by a global pandemic. The designation is valid through December 2022.

As part of the effort to be designated a voter-friendly campus, the MCC Votes! Team spearheaded creation of an internal webpage with voting information; service-learning classes partnered with the League of Women Voters; and the College participated in New Jersey Secretary of State Tahesha Way's 2020 Ballot Bowl, placing third, the only community college to place. 

Spring into a Healthy Exercise Program

With the arrival of warm weather, it is time to change your sedentary habits. Most spinal problems are related to the muscles and joints which supports the back.

Tense, chronically contracted muscles can start a chain of physiological events which can lead to many different kinds of back, hip and neck pain. Excessive tension in muscles creates rigidity which diminishes blood and oxygen circulation causing the muscles to become inflexible and more susceptible to sprains, strains and tears. This stress causes imbalances to these muscles and joints. Muscle imbalances can put unnatural demands on tissues and ligaments of your spine causing damage to discs, ligaments and nerves of the spine. Musculoligamentous health and balance depends upon a delicate balance between muscular strength and ligaments suppleness. Exercise such as yoga, and Tai Chi promote muscle relaxation and flexibility through slow breathing and stretching. They can also promote spinal stabilization and balance coordination.

Essential elements of a successful exercise program 1. Wear comfortable clothing. 2. Keep movements long and slow, and gentle. 3. Move with your breath. Inhale when you stretch. Exhale when you curl or fold your body. 4. Concentrate on your movements. 5. When it signals pain, ease up and don't force the movement. 6. Exercise regularly in a pleasant and quiet environment.

As always, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!

I did hear of a keeper Striped Bass weighing about 18 pounds from Union Beach. There have been some Striped Bass caught in the back areas of LBI. Some Winter Flounders have been caught in upper Barnegat Bay and Shark River, it's not great, but most of the Flounder caught are quite large. Party boat fishing is a pick of a few Cod and Ling. Far offshore trips are still catching big Porgies, some Cod, Pollock and a few Bluefish too There are no Mackerel being caught at this time. Fluke regulations and seasons are the same as last year. Three fish at 18 inches and a late May to mid-September season. A later season from the end of May to late September adding 3 extra days, is what most people wanted, but the Marine Fisheries council voted otherwise.

Fresh Water

Streams and lakes that are stocked with Trout are closed for stocking until April 10th opening day at 8AM. There will be no in season closures as in previous years for restocking. Stocking will be on a random basis to discourage crowds due to Covid 19 Pandemic regulations. I have not heard of any holdover Trout caught anywhere. Snow Piles melting and water runoff may be a factor. Stokes Sport Shop in Sussex county reported Walleye fishing in the upper Delaware has been poor.

Mark Bratus: Talented Athlete & More

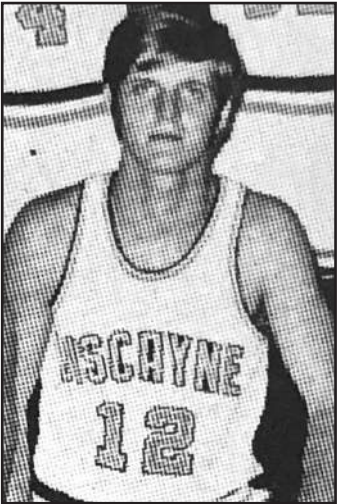
Former St. Mary's HS great, Mark Bratus, 70, died on March 7. If you were around South Amboy or Sayreville back in the 1960's, you probably knew or heard of Mark, who was respected and admired by all. Most people remember him for his outstanding basketball abilities, but he also excelled in baseball, and after his college days, became a top-notch Slow Pitch Softball player.

My first memories of Mark go back to St. Mary's Grammar School in '65 when he and Jim McCloud starred for the 8th Grade basketball team, leading a strong Blue & Gold squad. The dynamic duo of Bratus and McCloud would continue to team up right through senior year, and become two of the best players in Middlesex County.

Not too many people associate Mark with being an excellent baseball player, but I was honored to be his teammate on the legendary Mechanicsville Fire Co. South Amboy Babe Ruth League champs of 1964-65-66, and saw first hand what a top-notch baseball player he was. He was a fine second baseman who made some excellent plays, and I was right next to him playing first base in '66, along with so many other great teammates including former Major League Baseball Manager Tom Kelly, who guided the Minnesota Twins to 2 World Series crowns in '87 and '91.

In addition to his sports prowess, he was a born leader, possibly the most popular guy in the graduating class of '69, who was elected Senior Class President. Everyone in the school knew him, and respected his easy-going, and friendly personality.

As a junior, he broke the school's single-game scoring record by pouring in 35 points, and the record lasted until his buddy, McCloud broke it with 36 points the following season. Those were the days, back in the 60's, when St. Mary's gym was

completely packed, to follow the Eagles powerhouse basketball team, and especially during the 1968-69 season, during which the Blue & Gold finished with one of the best records in the school's history (21-4), losing a heartbreaker in the state championship game at Atlantic City's Convention Hall.

Mark and Jim McCloud both received scholarships to Biscayne University in Florida, where they played varsity basketball against some of the best players in the country, including Artis Gilmore, of Jacksonville University, who went on to a stellar NBA career. Following graduation, Bratus spent most of his career in the education field, and along the way, was elected to the South Amboy Board of Education. In addition, Mark coached his alma mater, St. Mary's boys varsity basketball team for a couple of years. God bless Mark, a great who will never be forgotten.

Toth Excelled At Sayreville

Danielle M. Toth graduated from Sayreville War Memorial HS in 1991, after an outstanding school girl career both scholastically and athletically, where she received many accolades and honors. Some of her great accomplishments included being selected to the All-State Group 4 Field Hockey team; All-North Jersey; All-Middlesex County; Scholar-Athlete for

Sayreville War Memorial HS. Danielle was one of the captains of the Field Hockey team, and as a sophomore, was chosen Sayreville's Player of the Week after scoring a hat trick. In addition, she was awarded a tuition scholarship to Central Michigan University, a Division 1 college, where she starred in Field Hockey for all 4 years.

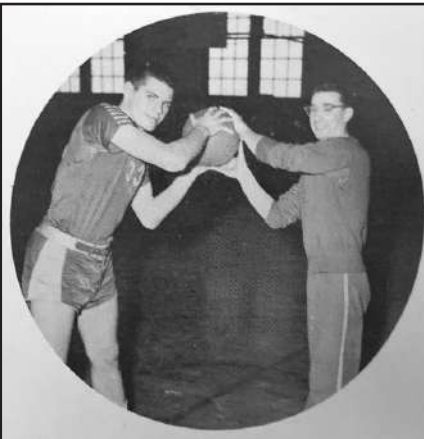

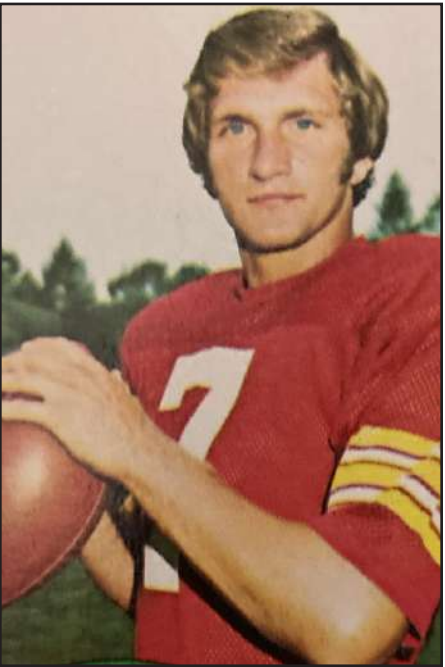

South River HS History



Joe Theismann was another outstanding high school athlete at South River HS in the late '60's, and many of our Sayreville, Hoffman, and St. Mary's HS athletes faced him in football, baseball, and basketball. After a stellar collegiate career at Notre Dame University, Joe went on to star in the Canadian Professional Football League. In 1974, he signed with the Washington Redskins in the NFL, where he had a near Hall of Fame career, before retiring after the '85 season. In his career, he threw for 25,206 yards, and 160 touchdowns for Washington, and is the only starting quarterback to win the Super Bowl, and also a league MVP award, not to be selected for the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

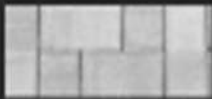

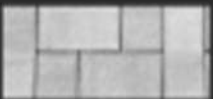
