New Police Chief In South Amboy

South Amboy has made history with the appointment of Patricia Kanecke as the City's first female Police Chief on April 2, 2025. In a ceremony held at South Amboy City Hall, Chief Kanecke was officially sworn in by Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin, former South Amboy resident. With twenty-seven years of dedicated service in law enforcement, Chief Kanecke has demonstrated exceptional leadership, commitment to public safety and is entrenched in the South Amboy community. Her appointment is a testament to her unwavering commitment and the evolving landscape of the city. The Chief has been quoted as saying "I am honored and humbled to serve as the Chief of Police for South Amboy. This role is not just about leadership; it's about service, trust, and building stronger relationships between our department and the community we protect." Community Spotlight: NY Waterway's Reggie Jackson

Riders on NY Waterway's commuter ferry from South Amboy to Manhattan can count on dependable service, a relaxing ride, beautiful views – and Reggie Jackson (no, not the New York Yankees Hall of Famer).

Jackson is the primary deckhand on the NY Waterway ferry, the friendly face who greets passengers every day and makes sure the hour-long ride is a smooth and enjoyable one.

Jackson's workday starts at around 5am every morning, as he gets the boat ready for its morning and return journeys. Later, he greets passengers, takes tickets, and records daily head counts. Along the way to and from the city, as the ferry passes the Statue of Liberty and comes within sight of Manhattan's

majestic skyline, he enjoys pointing out the sights and sharing information about the many notable landmarks.

Jackson is, himself, a South Amboy resident – in fact, he can see the NY Waterway ferry dock from his apartment window. It's just a quick drive or e-bike ride to work every weekday. A Queens, New York, native, he has lived in South Amboy for the past decade.

"Working for NY Waterway gives me an opportunity to interact with South Amboy commuters, share some of the things I love about the city and, most importantly, get them to where they need to be, safely and dependably," says Jackson. "It's a great job – and being out on the water every day is a huge bonus."

FROM THE DESK OF TOM REILLY

Our history has an astounding and often undervalued ability to teach us important lessons about our current affairs. Many of the seemingly novel issues we face are in fact old problems in a new guise. For example, I am sure many of us feel that mobile phones and the internet have had an unprecedented effect on our lives. True, but you might be surprised to know that people living through the late nineteenth century experienced similar changes brought about by (landline) telephones and the telegraph. In 1961, speaking about the newest machine of mass media at the time – the television – FCC chairman Newton Minnow lamented, "when television is good...nothing is better...when television is bad...nothing is worse...[it] is a vast wasteland." I am confident many of us share similar sentiments regarding the internet.

Allow me to share with you a historical event from close to home. Seventy-five years ago, in May 1950, a shipment of explosives arrived in the South Amboy waterfront terminal via the Pennsylvania Railroad. At the time, South Amboy held the only terminal in the Port of New York and New Jersey that permitted unloading of large quantities of explosives. On the night of May 19, 1950, without warning, over 100 tons of explosives detonated. Dozens of people died. Hundreds were injured. Every home in South Amboy suffered some form of damage. The city's power grid was destroyed, causing a blackout. Governor Alfred Driscoll sent in the State Police and New Jersey National Guard. In minutes, the waterfront became a disaster area. The danger did not abate for years – it was not until 1953 that the United States Army finally removed over 60 live mines still lurking in the bay.

Who was to blame? There was plenty of it to go around. Congress investigated the Kilgore Manufacturing Company for failing to abide by federal regulations regarding the transport of explosives. The Pennsylvania Railroad and the Coast Guard



also received blame for failing to enforce the regulations. One thing seemed certain: there were rules in place to prevent such a tragedy, but someone – or everyone – neglected to follow them. Buried beneath the tragedy is an important lesson: it can be appealing to bypass established rules for purposes of ease, expediency, or profit, but we do so at our own risk. It may be the case that we do not appreciate such rules – unappealing as they may seem – until we live without them. I hope that we may collectively take stock of the lessons from the tragedy as its Seventy-Fifth Anniversary nears.

May also brings Memorial Day. I know I speak for all of us in expressing sincere gratitude for every person who gave their life for our country. I often turn to Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address as the greatest written work eulogizing those who gave their lives not just for our nation, but for its ideals. As Lincoln noted, our greatest act of remembrance is to continue to strive towards the nation's highest principles of liberty, equality, and democracy. Lincoln himself was murdered 160 years ago, in April 1865. New Jersey's own Walt Whitman captured the nation's sadness in his poem, "When Lilacs Last in the Dooryard Bloom'd" – a brilliant work of remembrance evoking images of spring, and a very good read this time of year.

The Smoke Column

In previous “Smoke Column” articles I have written about Lithium-Ion (LI) batteries and fires that have occurred in the home as a result of them. Articles included Electric Vehicles (EV’s) and the hazardous materials they present. In most of these scenarios, the responding fire department was able to determine a burning hazardous material upon their arrival. But how about the unknown, where LI batteries are stored for repairs, exchanges, or replacement distribution? Must the warehouse/storage facility sites report to someone that LI batteries are stored on site? On June 29, 2021, in Morris, Illinois at the old Federal Paper Board facility an estimated 180,000 to 200,000 pounds of LI batteries caught fire. This fire caused a series of explosions that destroyed the warehouse and sent thick plumes of “highly poisonous” and “very deadly” fumes into the surrounding community. Local officials and first responders were unaware that the building, believed to be unoccupied for the past 35 years since the plant closed, was housing approximately one hundred tons of LI batteries. First responders initially attacked the fire with water since that was their only option at the time but that only intensified the fire and it turned into an uncontrollable situation. The fire continued to burn until specialized chemicals, “Purple K,” were brought to the scene. A year after this incident, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency was still in the process of cleaning up the hazardous substances from the fire. The Superior Battery Inc, owners of the site, were cited for violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and the Pollution Control Board regulations related to the release of pollutants to the atmosphere and water, and to improper waste handling. The concern following this incident is how aware are the local communities of any type of LI battery storage sites in their towns?

How easily could these sites be overlooked and not reported? Every town has some type of warehouse or storage facility. Why can’t a pallet or truckload of LI batteries be stored inside one? How about someone’s two-car garage in the neighborhood being used as a small site? Any amount of LI battery storage can lead to a major disaster, quick and deadly. Laws, regulations, codes and building inspections are all necessary for life safety. But what happens when the storage site is established illegally? Surprising a fire department to a LI battery explosion/fire site has many unknowns. The potential is there for local first responders to come across a similar incident. Take a look at what homeowners store in their garages besides gasoline, propane tanks, etc. The most common sources for LI batteries in our garages come from portable yard tools, e-mobility devices (bicycles, scooters), and electric vehicles which contain thousands of battery cells. Any one cell can become defective and start to burn which will ignite adjoining cells alongside it and will continue to intensify in uncontrolled fire. It is also reported that over 13% of residential homes have photovoltaic arrays on their roofs with many having a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) installed in their garage, or worse yet, inside their living spaces such as a closet or basement. These BESS’s use LI chemistry cells and any failure could cause a discharge of carbon monoxide or hydrogen, both deadly gases. For emergency responders this represents an extremely dangerous situation. These types of areas need to be strictly monitored and made known to first responders of what is being stored inside. A signage program that is used for the truss floor/roof identification on structures may be a helpful starting point for initial identification of storage facilities.



My Hometown, South Amboy

God willing, I plan to write several stories about my growing up years in this Pleasant Little City. As I look back at those days from where I am today, I smile and wonder where the time went. However, before we get to my stories I want to tell you a little about the history of this little town and the part it played in the history of our state and country.

Today, South Amboy is a mile square. Back in the 1800's it was much larger. It once extended as far as Cranbury and to the border of Monmouth County. It was a sprawling township 18 miles long and 6 miles wide.

The town grew out of the city across the Raritan Bay, Perth Amboy. Perth Amboy was a colonial port, and the first capital of the area called East Jersey. It eventually became the capital of the Jersey colony until the 1776 Revolution. William Franklin was the last royal governor. He was also the estranged son of Benjamin Franklin. The area across the bay was called the South Ward of Perth Amboy and hence the name when it separated from Perth Amboy. South Amboy was a perfect connecting point for the journey from New York to Philadelphia. A ferry connected the Amboys to the long stagecoach road from South Amboy to Bordentown, the stagecoach road that continued the long journey to Philadelphia. That road still exists today and is called Bordentown Avenue. It begins at the water's edge of Raritan Bay and continues through the city on its way across the state.

Back in the colonial days the journey from New York City to Philadelphia took around five days. South Amboy was a perfect spot to rest and relax prior to continuing the journey. So, several hotels sprang up, and taverns for "socializing" thus began the long tradition of taverns in the city. In my day there were about 40!

During the Revolution it is reported that the town was used as a lookout for British ships in the bay, at that time called Amboy Bay. An important early resident was Major General James Morgan who was on Washington's staff and was responsible for patrolling and protecting the area. He is buried in the family cemetery on a hilltop overlooking a picturesque view of Raritan Bay. A section of the town is called Morgan in his honor.

South Amboy's economy was always directed to shipping, fishing and manufacturing. It had big clay deposits, and a profitable pottery and terra cotta industry developed. There were once three terracotta and pottery factories in town. I remember exploring the abandoned factories as a kid and finding pottery items that were still usable.

However, it was the railroad that was to become the greatest factor in the city's growth and development. The Stevens family-owned property in both Perth and South Amboy. They would later settle in Hoboken where they founded Stevens Institute of Technology. John Stevens brought the first steam engine (the John Bull) made in England to New Jersey. His sons founded the Camden & Amboy Railroad in 1831. Here again, South Amboy's unique location became very important as the rail line followed the old stagecoach route. The Camden & Amboy railroad was the first of several railroads that passed through the city. Later there would be many: The New York & Long Branch, The Raritan River, Jersey Central, and of course, The Pennsylvania Railroad. The train whistles were heard throughout the day when I was growing up. Many of those trains brought coal from the Pennsylvania coalfields to be unloaded into barges for transport to New York City and power plants along the northeast coast. However, there were other types of goods transported to the city for further water distribution. One of these was military explosives that led to one of the major disasters the town experienced.

It happened on May 19, 1950, at the coal docks. Explosives (land mines) were being loaded onto barges for transport to a larger ship in the bay when something went wrong. Thirty-one loaders were killed, and debris was blown on the streets near the waterfront, and just about every window in town was blown out and many people were injured. The National Guard came into town that night to protect property and help restore calm. I lived on the waterfront and will remember that day for the rest of my life. My friend "Tank" Leonard and I were playing stickball down by the water when a large orange ball started to rise in the sky. We stood there looking at it with awe and wonder. Then the ground started to shake, and a tremendous roar followed. I remember people coming out of their houses in shock and many were bleeding from the windows that shattered in their homes. Our house was a mess: there were no windows, and the floor had caved in. We spent the next several days with relatives whose home did not suffer the damage that the waterfront houses did. I was not injured, but my brother and mother were. A plate glass window at a candy shop got my brother, and my mother was hit by flying can goods at the grocery store. My dad, who had a few Jameson's in him, slept through the whole thing. When he woke up, he asked: "What the hell happened?"

I could go on, but I think you have a pretty good picture of the town I was born and raised in. Now some lighter stuff!

Some Of Our Notable People

Let's start with Harold G Hoffman, the 41st governor of New Jersey from 1934 to 1938. He enlisted as a private in World War I and served overseas rising to a captain and eventually a full colonel. While he was governor, he was fully involved in the Lindberg kidnapping case. He strongly felt that Bruno Hauptmann was innocent of the kidnapping and murder of the Lindberg child and did everything he could to commute the death sentence. He was unsuccessful and some say that was the end of his political career. However, to me his most important achievement was getting my father back into the country after he was deported for jumping ship. Except for him, I might not have come along!

For its size South Amboy was well represented in major league baseball:

Allie Clark played for the New York Yankees, Cleveland Indians, Philadelphia Athletics, and Chicago White Sox. He was a teammate of many famous players and had two World Series rings: 1947 with the Yankees, and 1948 with the Cleveland Indians. During the off-season he had a tavern called The Sportsman's Inn, and many of his big-league friends would visit. I pestered him into giving me a Cleveland Indian hat. I had to fill it with paper to make it fit. He was a nice man who always had time for the kids. He died in 2012.

The O'Brien twins (Johnny and Eddie) put my high school, St. Mary's on the map. They were outstanding basketball and baseball players. They got scholarships to Seattle University and put that school on the map. Johnny, only about five ten, scored 43 points against the Harlem Globetrotters in 1952. They were very instrumental in convincing Elgin Baylor to attend Seattle University. Both were All-American basketball and baseball players. Bing Crosby, then a part owner of the Pittsburgh Pirates, signed them to a "Bonus Baby" contract. They were the first twins to play in the same game in major league history. And they were only one of four brothers in major league history to play second base and shortstop in the same game. They played for the Pittsburgh Pirates, St. Louis Cardinals and Milwaukee Braves. After they left baseball, they returned to Seattle and had very distinguished careers. Eddie died in 2014.

John (Jack) McKeon, famously known as "Trader Jack," had a long-distinguished career as a major league executive and manager. He managed: The Kansas City Royals, Oakland Athletics, San Diego Padres, Cincinnati Reds and finally the 2003 Florida Marlins (now Miami Marlins) when they won the World Series. He was also the General Manager of the National League Pennant-winning Padres of 1986. He is the only manager in professional baseball history to have won over 1,000 games in both the minor leagues and Major League Baseball.

Fishing Flashes

Salt Water
Striped Bass fishing in Raritan Bay remains slow. I checked local beaches at Cliffwood, Keansburg and South Amboy. The people I spoke to did not get any bites either. I heard of a few fish caught but have yet to see any. Party boats that fished in the bay have caught very few short Stripers. It's different in Toms River and in the Barnegat Bay area. It's mostly a bait deal on blood worms. Some Winter Flounder have been caught here but Shark River in Belmar has produced a decent number of fish. Party boat fishing remains a pick of Ling and Blackfish. Some of these Blackfish are good sized. Surf Fishing so far has been nonexistent. The few people who tried it at LBI and Island beach did nothing so far. This should change any day now that the warmer weather is on the way.

Fresh Water
The bad weather that gave us problems carried into opening day on April 5th. High water, rain and cold limited catching. I didn't get out that day, but I checked Spring Lake the day after and saw 3 nice size Rainbows caught between 16 and 18 inches. Some Walleyes have been caught at a few locations along the Delaware River. The first Shad have also entered the river. The first commercial fishing above Lambertville dropped the nets and came up with 3 Shad. More will follow.

The WWII Letters From The Soldiers Of Sayreville Book Release

In celebration of the 80th anniversary of the end of WWII, the Sayreville Historical Society is proud to announce the publication of a new, limited-edition book honoring the borough's World War II veterans, "Sayreville's Operation Snow Cone: The WWII Letters From The Soldiers of Sayreville," by author and former Sayreville resident, Chris Nieratko.

The 204-page hardcover book contains letters and postcards written by Sayreville servicemen and women to local businessman Danny O'Brien, owner of Danny's Luncheonette and Spa on Main Street, Sayreville in the last years of WWII. During WWII, O'Brien penned one of the most comprehensive letter-writing campaigns in U.S. history to locals serving in the war asking for their photographs he planned to display in albums. Many responded with words from around the globe telling tales of their experiences far from home and a longing for hamburgers and banana splits.

These 185 letters remained unopened and unread until they were recently discovered by O'Brien's granddaughter, Kristen O'Brien Neymarc, in January of 2024 as she and family members sorted through her father's papers. While she and her family knew of her grandfather's diners in Sayreville and Woodbridge, no one was aware of his WWII correspondence until they found the letters sealed and preserved in a water-tight ammunition box.

After the discovery, O'Brien Neymarc reached out to The Historical Society and Nieratko, the author of the 2023 Historical Society collection "Give 'Hell: Sayreville Goes to War," a collection of photographs of Sayreville WWII servicemen and women displayed in attorney Joseph Karcher's office on Main Street. Over the past year, the letters were catalogued and preserved

by Historical Society volunteers. O'Brien Neymarc authored a one-act play describing both the discovery of the letters and the writers themselves. The title of the book comes from one soldier's homesick letter where he states he was missing Danny's ice cream so badly that he took his chocolate ration and crushed it onto some packed snow to create a makeshift snow cone.

In recognition of the 80th Anniversary of WWII's V-E Day and the book's publication, the Sayreville Historical Society is planning an afternoon of remembrance on May 3 from 1 to 3 pm in the Active Adult Center, 423 Main Street, Sayreville. "Sayreville's Operation Snow Cone: The Danny O'Brien Letters" will be available for purchase at \$45.

O'Brien Neymarc and Nieratko will be on-hand to discuss the project and be available for questions. Several correspondences will be read, and the letters will be available for viewing. In addition, O'Brien Neymarc's play will be read by local actors.

The Historical Society will display artifacts from its own WWII collection, including recent donations from the family of Ed Kolodziej, the holder of the Silver Star, the Bronze Star, the Combat Infantry Badge, and the New Jersey Distinguished Service Medal.

In addition, children will be able to write letters or color pictures to be delivered to the Menlo Park veteran's home. Local veterans will be available to talk about their experiences with children and students. Outside the building, visitors can explore several historic military vehicles in the parking lot.

Light refreshments, including snow cones, will be served.

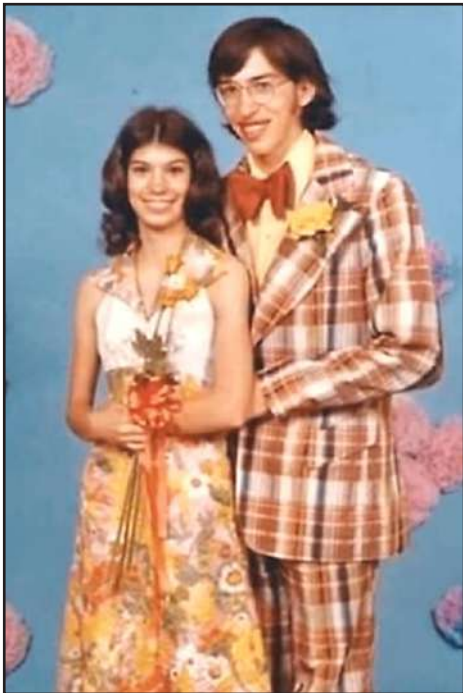
