Kilpatrick Wins Recount For Mayor

Sayreville Democrat Victoria Kilpatrick was once again the winner for the mayoral seat, in a December 5th court-ordered recount, edging Republican Arthur J. Rittenhouse, by 6 votes, 3,634-3,628.

The recount was held by the Middlesex County Board of Elections and the Middlesex County Clerk, at the Middlesex County Board of Elections voting machine warehouse in Edison. Kilpatrick received an additional 5 mail-in votes, while Rittenhouse picked up 2 via the mail-in process.

Rittenhouse said that he plans to continue to contest the result, and will file a challenge, in Superior Court. He felt that there were "irregularities" in the election, including the 41 provisional ballots, voting machine counts, and other problems.

Kilpatrick will vacate her spot on the Borough Council on Dec. 31st to assume the role of Mayor, for which she will be sworn in on January 1, 2020, replacing long-time Republican Mayor Kennedy who did not seek election after serving 20 years in the top post.

Father Krull Installed As Pastor

On Nov. 2nd, Our Lady of Victories former pastor Father Michael G. Krull was installed as pastor of Our Lady of Peace Church in Fords. Father Krull began his priestly career when he was ordained on May 31, 1986 at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi, Metuchen.

Speaker Craig Coughlin received the Legislator of the Year Award at the N.J. State Policemen Benevolent Association's 123rd annual Valor Awards banquet on Nov. 23rd in Atlantic City. Under his outstanding leadership, the Assembly has passed several pieces of legislation to benefit law enforcement, and much more.

Remembering Rich Wendell Of Olde Towne Deli & Liquors

Richard "Rich" Wendell, 67, of Lakewood, who was the former owner of Olde Towne Deli & Liquors from 1982-1996, passed away on December 7th. Rich or Rick as I called him was born in Orange, NJ, and later lived in Cliffwood Beach for many years during the time he owned Olde Towne (OT).

A proud U.S. Navy veteran of the Vietnam War era, he served from 1972-75 and was honorably discharged.

He had a wonderful personality and great sense of humor, and became very popular and well-liked by locals who patronized his store. Eventually, he purchased English's Pub, around 1986 or '87, which was two doors over from OT, and named it Tutty Tease (TT). As if running OT wasn't enough for him to do, he now had much more responsibility with a busy bar business, and eventually sold it after a couple of years.

Olde Towne Deli & Liquors, and Tutty Tease sponsored local teams in softball and basketball, and Rick was always generous with local charities or those in need.

Rick was up for it, and did very well with

both establishments, eventually selling TT, and in 1996 sold OT. Following the sale of OT, he became a limousine driver for a large NJ company, and always told stories about famous people who he would drive from the airports to different engagements throughout the area. Two of the most renowned were Dr. Ruth, a famous talk-show personality, and Dallas Cowboys football star Michael Irvin. In addition he drove pro wrestlers, and actors and actresses to and from the airports.

As far as hobbies, we know he was an expert with guns, and also a collector, who was very knowledgeable about all makes and models, no matter how old they were.

He continued as a driver until his health started failing, many years ago, but he continued to keep up with local and worldwide events via computer or television.

Richard "Rich" "Rick" Wendell was one of the really "good" guys"... No he was a "great" guy, and the kind of faithful friend everyone should be lucky enough to have. God bless Rick. You will be missed, but never forgotten.

Yearbook-Sayreville 1979

Henry Counsman was the Superintendent of Schools. Some popular teachers were Elyse Gelson, Laura Long, Ellen Shur, Bruce Brindza, JoAnne Pooley, Barbara Albanir, Dr. George Marotta, Kevin Corrigan, Susan Maurer, Susan Jaysnovitch, Steve Cserr, Elena Leone. The yearbook was dedicated to James & Irene Todd. John Klein and Jacqueline Saltzman were Editors-In-Chief of the yearbook. Debbie Richel was 1978 Homecoming Queen. Mary Jane Briody was Student Council President; VP-Karen Brent; Sec.-Gina Guerrieri; Treas.-Kathy Russo. Senior Class officers were President Grace Pohl; VP-Debbie Richel; Sec.-Karen Frezzi; Treas.-Mary Lynn Sollecito. Social events included the school play, "Prisoner of Second Avenue," and "Beatlemania" with The Rubber Soul Band. On the sports scene, the girls cross country team was a perfect (12-0), and the boys (14-0) and 2nd place in the county under Coach Gerry Carney. The winter track team was (11-2); girls basketball (16-6) under Coach Judy Sunski; girls gymnastics (7-2); girls tennis (17-8).

On the national scene, the top movie was "Apocalypse Now." The Susan B. Anthony dollar flopped. 1979 was the first year for using male names for hurricanes. Frederic and David were nasty ones. The Smoke Column

In the last "Smoke Column" of the year we look back on the previous year for any significant fires. Fortunately, this past year we have not had any deaths related to fire in the communities of South Amboy and Sayreville. Nor have we had any firefighters sustain a major injury while fighting fires or working other types of emergency incidents in either the South Amboy Fire Department or the Sayreville Fire Department. Kudos to the chiefs, the line officers, and the members themselves for performing their duties diligently and using the utmost safety.

Chief Brian Tierney of the South Amboy Fire Department reported that there were a few significant house fires in South Amboy during the year especially those occurring on Wilmot Street and Cedar Street. Firefighters responded quickly to these fires and were able to extinguish the flames before full extension of the fire got hold of the structure. Our first priority as fire fighters is to rescue any occupants that are in danger, and at times, at risk to our own lives. Our second priority is to effectively attempt to save the structure but not at the cost of a firefighter's life. A structurally unsafe building will be demolished and can be re-built after the fire. The life of a resident or a firefighter that is killed in a fire cannot.

Sayreville Fire Chief Kevin Krushinski report that there were a few significant structure fires in the Borough this past year but none resulting in a loss of life. These fires occurred on Wlodarczyk Place, Smith Street, Skytop Garden Apartments, and Price Street. The Skytop Garden apartment fire occurred during a severe electrical storm where the structure itself got struck by lightning causing fires to occur in the walls,

attic, and other concealed spaces which made it difficult to locate. While the storm was still at its height and under dangerous conditions, firefighters advanced hose lines into the building attempting to locate these hidden pockets of fire. After opening up walls and ceilings, all fires were located and extinguished. The structure fire on Price Street was fully involved while a general alarm of fire was being transmitted. When firefighters arrived on the scene, they found fire was blowing out the front windows, front door, and windows on the right side of the structure. The flames coming out the right side windows were a concern because they were impinging upon the vinyl siding on the house next door causing it to melt away from the home. Fire hoses were immediately applied to the house on fire and to the house on the right to keep it from becoming involved in fire. Unfortunately, the residents could not return to their home as it was totally destroyed in the fire. It is always a sad situation when a fire of this nature occurs around the holidays and in this case, that family lost all their belongings.

As the year comes to an end, we look forward to new incoming officers to lead our fire departments. We wish them the best of luck and pray that they make the correct decision as they guide their departments/companies throughout the year. With their training and experience we know that they will do their jobs efficiently and effectively with the number one priority always in mind, the safety of all their people.

In closing I wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy, Healthy New Year. I hope that you have found these articles to be interesting and informative.

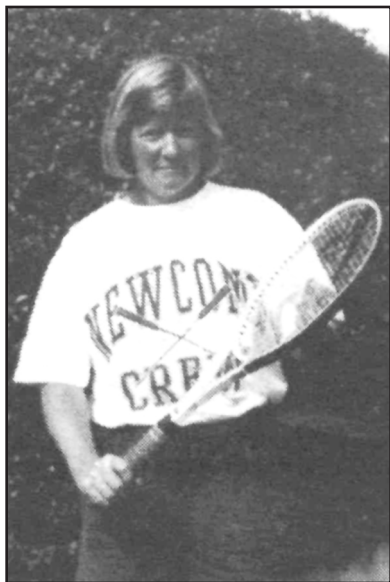

Remembering Melanie Newcomb: Great Athlete, Coach, Leader

Former South Amboy resident Melanie Newcomb passed away on Dec. 6th at 68 years old. "Mel" as almost everyone affectionately called her, was a highly-competitive and extremely-talented athlete growing up in the 1960's in the Mechanicsville section of South Amboy. Living across the street from Mel, I, and many others in our neighborhood, who hung around together, with sports as a common interest, became great friends with her. When school was out for summer, the "gang" would play whiffle ball most of the day, and later switch to steammin' in, with a sponge ball against a neighbor's garage that had a box drawn on it with chalk or coal from the nearby railroad tracks. We played other games such as curb ball, punch ball, and kickball, anything competitive, and Mel was always ready for a sports game with mostly boys in our neighborhood. She not only was a tremendous competitor, but also better than most of the boys, who were all pretty good athletes. Mel was very talented athletically, and a good person, and when she went to St. Mary's HS as a freshman, became an instant scoring sensation on the girls varsity basketball team

to lead the Eaglettes, as they were called back then, by averaging 14 points points per game. Unfortunately, girls sports programs in high school were just getting started at the time, and they did not get the exposure boys sports did.

St. Mary's did not have a girls softball program then, and if it had one, you can bet Mel would have easily been the standout player. Following graduation in 1970, she went to Sacred Heart College in North Carolina, but they had no women's sports, so she transferred to Kean College, where she played right field as a junior and led the team with a .441 batting avg., but sat out her senior year to do student-teaching. later became a physical education teacher for many years until her retirement. Her coaching credentials included: assistant track coach, boys junior high basketball, junior high cheerleaders, Spotswood High girls varsity softball coach for one season going (14-7) and playing in the state tourney. She also started a girls basketball program and was a high school basketball referee for 2 years.

Mel's greatest coaching honors came in 1995, when she guided the Spotswood boys tennis team to an outstanding (17-2) record, one of the finest in Middlesex County, and was selected Coach of the Year by both The Home News, and also The News Tribune.

She knew sports inside and out, and her vast knowledge combined with her teaching ability, and natural leadership, made her one of the top coaches in Middlesex County.

I think it's safe to say that Melanie Newcomb was the greatest female basketball player at St. Mary's HS during the 60's decade, and if they offered softball, she would have been #1 in that too. In basketball, she could really shoot, dribble, and play tight defense. Everyone would have loved to see her on a softball field--if only the Eaglettes had a team back then!

The kids in my neighborhood and I were blessed to have grown up with Mel, who played sports really hard, and drove us to become better competitors, when facing her each day in our summer games, and also winter, on the Conover Street basketball court, (now John Ciszewski Park). She was a good friend and neighbor who I will certainly miss, but never forget. God Bless, Mel.

He also worked out for Miami Heat and Milwaukee Bucks during the off-season, before signing with Club Balconesto Murcia also known as UCAM Murcia team that plays in the Liga ACB. Townes has appeared in 6 of the team's 10 games, and has a scoring avg. of 7.2 ppg.

Middlesex County College Announces Inaugural Athletic Hall of Fame Class

The Middlesex County College Athletic Hall of Fame Committee announced the names of the inaugural class of the College's Hall of Fame. The first class will feature Robert Edmonds (Track and Field), Dave Meads (Baseball), Jill Romanovsky (Softball), John Sacchi (Wrestling Coach) and Robert Zifchak (Athletic Administrator).

"We are really excited to announce the first class of inductees to the MCC Hall of Fame," said Athletic Director Derrick Johnson. "We have such a rich history of athletics and this recognition really is long overdue."

Edmonds (Metuchen), hailed from Woodbridge and attended MCC from 1974-1976. He was a standout on the men's indoor and outdoor track & field teams. During his freshman year at MCC he claimed the Region Championship as a pole vaulter. Edmonds still holds the pole vaulting record at MCC after 43 years of competition. During his sophomore year he repeated as region champ in the pole vault and competed in the National Championship. Edmonds also qualified for Nationals in the high jump, recording a 6 ft. jump while standing 5'6 inches tall. He placed 8th out of 16 jumpers nationally. While at MCC Edmonds also excelled in the long jump and 4x110 events.

Meads a native of Monroe Township, New Jersey was a left-handed pitcher while at MCC and became the first player in Middlesex athletic history to rise to the ranks of major league baseball. Meads, a Monroe High School graduate, was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 6th round of the 1984 Major League Baseball January Draft. The southpaw harbored a dream to pitch in the big leagues and on April 13, 1987, he appeared in his first game with the Astros. Meads won two-thirds of his major league games, recording an 8-4 overall pitching record. He now lives in California.

Romanovsky, a former J. P. Stevens High School student athlete from Edison, participated in the 1996 and 1997 seasons for Blue Colts Softball, and she was among the most dominant in Region XIX during her time at MCC. A hard-throwing pitcher with a devastating drop pitch in her arsenal, Romanovsky set Middlesex's career records for strikeouts in a season with 256, respectively, along with records in single season (22), career wins (42), single season earned run average (1.61) and career earned run average (2.05) during her time as a student-athlete. Romanovsky was named

a NJCAA All-American, as well as Region XIX Player of the Year, leading the team to the Region XIX postseason in both of her seasons. She now lives in Ocean County.

Sacchi (Edison) served as the head wrestling coach at MCC for over 23 seasons. While at MCC he totaled a 280-59-4 record including three undefeated seasons. With that record he became the second all-time winningest two-year college coach in the nation. Sacchi's wrestling campaigns produced 39 junior college All-Americans and five national champions. His teams won 38 tournament championships, placed second 24 times, and captured 160 individual championships. With Sacchi MCC wrestling found a home in the top 20 polls 17 times and placed fourth in 1973, 1983, and 1986.

Zifchak (Edison) most notably known for his commitment and dedication to MCC athletics for 34 years, was a long-time administrator and coach. Zifchak is considered as one of the trail blazers of two-year college athletics. Zifchak began his career at Middlesex County College in 1968 as an adjunct faculty member and athletic director. Upon arrival he completed the installation of several women's sports into the athletic arsenal, which predated the Title IX of Education Amendments in 1972. During his tenure he accumulated over 60 team championships for several sports.

"The inductees include some of the school's finest athletes from the earliest days of Blue Colt Athletics, and recognizes those who were instrumental in getting our programs off the ground," Johnson said. "I could not have hoped for a more deserving group of inductees for our first Hall of Fame class."

The Middlesex County College Athletic Hall of Fame is dedicated to fostering an appreciation for the role sports play in contributing to the student-athlete college experience. The Hall of Fame honors athletes, coaches, athletic administrators, and community leaders who have brought fame or honor to the Middlesex County College through their involvement in athletics.

The inaugural class members will be inducted at the MCC Hall of Fame Ceremony on Thursday, April 23, 2020 at West Hall on the campus of Middlesex County College.

The ready-reserves were Gene Croddick, Wally Wood, Clarence Bubaltz, John "Bunker" Kelly, Bill Richmond, Wilson Huff, and Pete Ewtushek.

1974-The South Amboy Touch Football League (SATFL) held its second and final season. In last month's issue, we said the 1972 League was the first and only year that it existed, and it was halted because of fighting. Apparently, there was no SATFL in '73, but returned in '74 for one final hurrah. 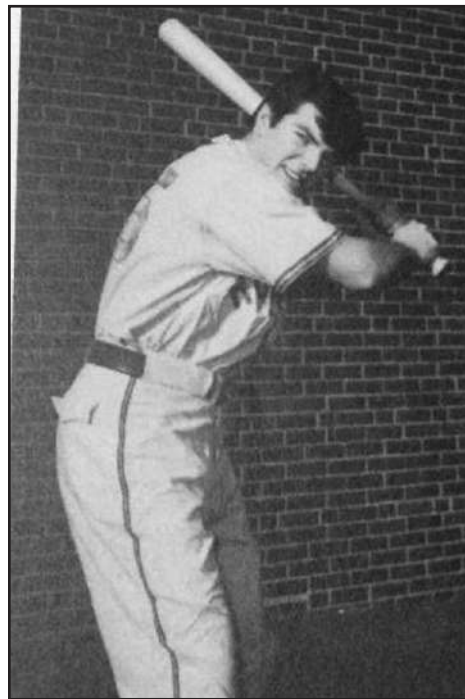
Tingle Remembered

Bill "Biff" McKeon MLB Baseball Scout - Part 6

After Bill finished up scouting for the KC Royals another opportunity came up. "Big" brother Jack, who was now the GM of the San Diego Padres, asked him to consider becoming a part-time scout for the Padres. Bill said yes and was back in the game. Old friendships would be renewed, and new ones made. Bill continues:

"I accepted the offer and re-birthed my scouting career as a part time scout with unlimited coverage. I scouted the AAA International League and the AA Eastern League, and some Major League during the 1981 season. During one of my scouting visits to Syracuse, New York along with my friends Buddy Kerr and Pete Gabrand, a chubby little fellow comes up and asks who I was. I told him I was Bill McKeon with the San Diego Padres. He then said he knew the Padres GM. He was in the Air Force with brother Jack and went on to relate some interesting stories. This got Buddy and Pete laughing. Later in the game, the guys came back and asked if I was related to the Padres GM? A lot of baseball people did not know we were brothers.

During the 1983 World Series brother Jack and I got into a "discussion" about who was the best catcher in the majors. Then he asked me if I wanted to come to the Padres spring training and be a coach, working with the catchers. I didn't say yes or no at that time, as I was still a High School Administrator. Later during the Christmas holidays, I had my second heart attack and had to step down from my High School Administration duties. So, I decided to take his offer and go to Spring Training in warm Yuma, Arizona. I finally made the majors, and was coaching future major league catchers Benito Santiago and Sandy Alomar Jr. I even dressed in the coaches' room, and manager Dick Williams would invite me into his office for a beer. One day I went into his office, and took some beer out to the other coaches and told them if they wanted more to just go into Dick's office and get one. I was told that no one went into the

manager's office unless invited, and I was the only one invited in for a beer."

(I can imagine that "discussion" between Jack and Bill since both were "pretty good" catchers in their day).

"After I recovered from my heart issues, I went back to High School Administration and part-time scouting. Jack later asked me if I was interested in scouting full time in the major leagues with the other Padre major league scout Dick Hager. I said no at first, but later changed my mind. One of the best decisions I ever made. During my tenure as a major league scout and special assistant to the GM, I met and associated with many Hall of Famers: players, managers and coaches as well as GMs and owners." (More on this next month).

"My career as a Major League Scout ended in 1990 when Joan Kroc sold the team. Mrs. Kroc ran the team after her husband Ray Kroc (the man who gave us McDonalds) died in 1984. With new ownership a lot of organization personnel did not have their contracts renewed, including me and the GM "Trader Jack".

In 1988 Lady Elizabeth (Betty) and I moved from South Amboy/Sayreville to Evansville, Indiana. My mom and dad had passed away, and I wanted Betty to be close to her father who was ill. Her mother had passed away. I met my Lady L in 1956 while playing for the Evansville Otters, and we were married in 1957. She was the sister of our outfielder Joe Unfried. Joe was a power hitter who eventually played AAA in the Pacific Coast League. In today's baseball world Joe would have made the majors. After I retired from scouting, I became the principal of a Catholic high school, and coached the Ashville University baseball team in Clinton Iowa from 1990 to 1996."

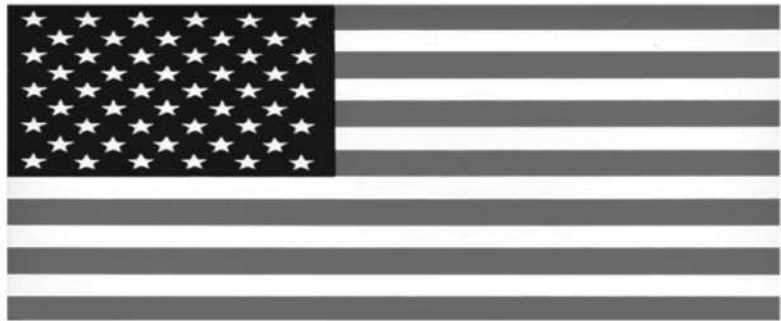

The correct answer to the November Where in NJ? is the Salem Municipal Building located in Salem, NJ. It was built in 1888 and used as the Salem National Bank and was located on East Broadway (New Jersey State Highway 49) In 1924, the bank was purchased by Salem City and was moved to its current location behind several businesses on New Market Street For years following the move this location was used as Salem City government offices, then these offices were moved to another location and now this building sits unoccupied except when City Council and other groups have their meetings. It is an exuberant example of the Queen Anne style, designed by Philadelphia architect David Evans. Two grants in the 1990's helped fund comprehensive exterior restoration works, and helped fund a restoration of original interior features and finishes, while upgrading electrical and mechanical systems.

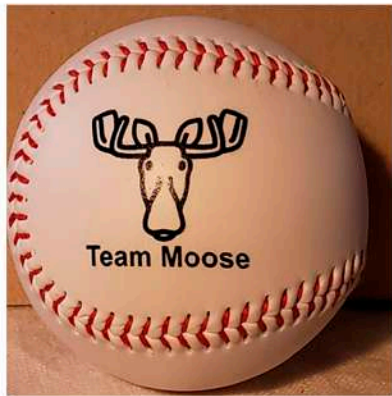

Does Santa Have Back Pain?

A potbelly changes the curvature of the back. The stomach pulls the backbone forward, stressing muscles and ligaments and putting pressure on discs. If you have ten extra pounds on your abdomen, you are putting an additional 100 pound strain on your back. This additional strain occurs because the lower part of your spine is not receiving adequate support from your weakened abdominal muscles. Your back muscles try to maintain the proper spinal balance, but after end up strained or sprained.

Although excess weight does not cause back problems, you can do something about it. Follow a diet and exercise program to maintain a healthy weight and strengthen your muscles. Develop healthy eating habits that work for you, and make exercise, diet and proper spinal-hygiene an important part of your day.

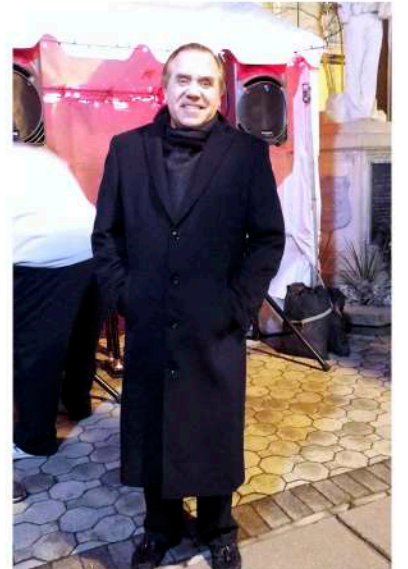

Salt Water

Striped Bass jig fishing on Party Boats has been pretty good. More shorts are mixed in but there are enough keepers to make a trip. Bluefish seem to be gone with the cold weather and storms that we had chasing them away. These weather conditions, however, improves Bass fishing. It's good in the surf at Island Beach and LBI. Here it is mostly shorts, but there are some keepers around to make it interesting. Lures like the needlefish plug and other long bodied lures are hot at this time. Fishing in Raritan Bay is slow. I only heard of a few shorts caught. Party Boat Blackfish is good with 5 fish common for those skillful anglers, as it takes a certain amount of skill to catch them. Offshore bottom fishing is mostly Ling. Unfortunately the Dogfish have moved in and taken over many of the spots normally fished. There are also Winter Flounder off the Belmar docks with anglers catching the limit of 2 fish. New regulations for Striped Bass will come out next year. They do not look good!

Fresh Water

Winter Trout stocking has begun with selected lakes in mid and upstate being selected on November 25th. Spring Lake was stocked with 200 Trout. Some leftover Trout prevail from the last fall stocking. A good place to try would be Round Valley Reservoir from the shore near the launch.

Home for the Holidays, Part One

I had waited a long, long time to return to the state where I had been born...never honestly believing I really ever would return. For a total of 28 ½ years, I had lived as a Yankee in the South...a Yankee whose Jersey accent was recognizable everywhere I went whenever I said words like cawfee, tawk and wawk, and, of course, Nork instead of Newark. Like a fog horn going off, just these words alone "shouted" Jersey girl...and I was very proud of it. Instead of the southerners influencing my accent, I seem to have had an influence on them by bringing phrases like "you guys" and "take good care" into their vocabulary. Once in a while, though, I'd make a slip and say "y'all" instead of "all of you," but those slips were few and far between...I think. Other than that, I proudly remained the woman who had been born and raised in the peaceful little city when actually it wasn't so peaceful, partly due to the almost ridiculous number of bars/taverns which got South Amboy into the Guinness Book of Records. I have learned through Ancestry.com that the earlier settlers in town had been more than just neighbors, as "the older families" have a cumulative DNA which seems to have a connecting root system like a big old oak tree. I know firsthand as I had dated someone I later learned was my third cousin. No, he wasn't my first love mentioned in last month's article. As for the aforementioned third cousin, not being able to pronounce his Polish last name without sounding drunk had made me "kick him to the curb" too after a few months. I did, though, meet my Polish cousin, Jill Furia, on ancestry. Her grandmother and my grandmother were Wiczorek sisters. Since then we have become the best of friends, probably because we are so much alike in

so many different ways, obviously thanks to our shared DNA. I really do think I'm related to over half the town and maybe that's what had been calling me home...all of my many ancestors wanting me to come back where I belonged. Whatever it was, it worked. No longer young...scratch that...being a senior citizen made driving home in a U-Haul truck with our old toothless cat in a cat carrier in the front seat and an obese Chihuahua squashing my legs as she sat on my lap made the journey to New Jersey seem like a journey to hell and back...except may times I didn't think getting back was in my future after all. Three days it took us to travel the 833 miles...three long days of problems.
