Eight Run For Sayreville BOE

Eight candidates are seeking three seats, The candidates seeking the terms are Christopher Callahan, Danielle Pieloch, Syed Muhammed S. Ali, Jessica Esposito, Eloy Fernandez, Zoe Katsilis, Alison Napolitano and Eileen Pabon.

South Amboy native, Michael "Mike" Deitche grew up in "The Pleasant Little City," attended St. Mary's Grammar School, graduating in 1970, and St. Mary's High School in 1974. During his grammar school days, he enjoyed going to high school basketball games, but his favorite sport to play was football, with the South Amboy Sabres Pop Warner football team, under coaches Russ Hahn and Bob Eppinger. A fine athlete, Mike, an offensive end, was selected Offensive Lineman of the Year in 1970. He said that "I'll never forget the thrill of playing with the Sabres at the Buffalo Bills Stadium in upstate New York."

A very friendly and popular person throughout his life, he said that his "best buddy" in grammar school for 8 years was John Connolly, who following graduation went to CBA. Mark Clark, Joe Kolakowski and Austin O'Malley were his closest friends and teammates on the Eagles varsity basketball team. John Scordinsky was the coach during Mike's junior year, but he gives a lot of credit to Charles "Chuck" Nuziale (now a Guidance Counselor at Bayonne HS), who coached during the 1973-74 season. "Without Charles Nuziale's discipline and physical fitness demands, I would never have been able to graduate from the NJ State Police Academy," said Deitche.

Mike was first bitten by the law enforcement bug, "During the riots in '68, when Col. David B. Kelly, the Superintendent of the NJ State Police was my neighbor, and

Mike Deitche: A South Amboy Success Story

Troopers would come up to his house, and we played basketball together. I was only 11 years old at the time, but noticed how loved and respected they were as state police officers. "

Capt. Trpisovsky, also a South Amboy neighbor, saw something special in Mike regarding his obvious interest in law enforcement, and recommended Deitche to attend NJ State Police Trooper Youth Week. Mike said, "I was very fortunate to go to Trooper Youth Week at the end of my junior year in high school." Under his senior class picture in the '74 yearbook his nickname was "Trooper Deitche," and his dream to make a career in law enforcement continued to grow.

Following graduation, he attended Biscayne College in Florida, majoring in Criminal Justice. His desire to pursue this field was inspired by college professors who "were retired cops and lawyers."

Mike Deitche's dream was fulfilled in 1978 when he was sworn in as a New Jersey State Police Officer. He said that "My biggest accomplishment was graduating from the New Jersey State Police Academy, which started with 103 candidates and ended with 60." Deitche worked his way up through the ranks to Lieutenant, and retired in 2004. "My number one priority was always to help people," he stated.

During his 26-year career, he had different assignments, starting at Bordentown then Fort Dix, Edison, the NJ Turnpike, and went to the prestigious Governor's Security

Unit, in 1981, where he provided protection for Governors Byrne, Kean, and Florio. Mike along with the Governor's Security Unit went to Brussels when the European Union was in its infancy, and Morocco with Gov. Kean for Malcolm Forbes 70th birthday, where he got to meet acting legend Elizabeth Taylor. When President Jimmy Carter was in New Brunswick in 1978-79, Lt. Deitche led the motorcade to the administration building, and was on duty for President Ronald Reagan and Vice-President George Bush when they were visiting New Jersey.

Since retiring, Mike has kept busy, and was active in Big Brothers, where he was inspired to go into teaching, because he wanted to give back to society. He taught reading and math to first and second graders for 3 years in Linden, in the summers. He began working as a private investigator, and would eventually start his own business in the investigation field. He has traveled all over the country while working for pharmaceutical companies, while providing security for corporate executive meetings and conferences for numerous companies.

For younger people hoping to enter the law enforcement or the military as a career, Mike said, "Law or military are noble jobs to help the citizens of our country."

South Amboy Family Displaced By Fire

A house fire gutted the home of a Second Street South Amboy family leaving them temporarily homeless. According to South Amboy Fire Chief Bob O'Connor, the fire destroyed the three story structure, but firefighters were able to save the neighboring Everlasting Ministries Church at 239 Second Street. Neighbor Genevieve McCreary is attempting to arrange for gift cards and other donations for the family of five, that includes a couple, their son, brother-in-law, and father-in-law. Authorities say the fire broke out around 11:30 p.m. October 8, at the 231 Second Street home. Residents tried to put out the blaze with a fire extinguisher, but had to leave the home along with the family dog, and escaped injury. O'Connor said the home sustained heavy damage to the first and second floors and water damage to the basement.

RIP, Halloween

The much awaited days of Trick or Treating are becoming but a memory for those of us who had held Halloween as the most exciting day of the entire year. When I was growing up in the '50s, as soon as the darkness came, the streets would be filled with kids dressed in Halloween costumes both store bought or homemade. On our faces were masks, heavier in weight and usually almost suffocating, but those masks were the most important part of the Halloween outfit. Each child, of course, would be carrying some kind of shopping bag or pillowcase to hold all the hoped for candy. Oh, and how we had to work to get that candy, hustling from one house to the next as fast as we could go. Slowpokes we weren't. At that time, trick or treating in America, was just becoming the rage all over the country instead of being for just small gatherings as it had been in our country since the 1920s. Now, one hundred years after it all began, Halloween as we had later known it back in the '50s, seems to be taking its last gasp...at least in the way it had been celebrated...the way we had thought it would always be.

Trick or treating is nothing "new" in Europe. As far back as the 16th century writers had told of people of all ages knocking on doors to get a "handout"...and threatening a "trick" if no treat was given. Often, they disguised themselves so they wouldn't be recognized later, afraid of being punished for the threat. Sadly, in the first half of the '80s, 1984, I believe but I could be off by a year, the first deadly blow to this American tradition was dealt when Halloween was canceled in Sayreville and possibly other towns nearby due to the very real fear of children getting tainted candy and apples hiding razor blades inside. Sickos seemed to have always been around but that year they seemed to all come from the sewer where they belonged in order to destroy the happiest day of the year for most kids.

Ever since that time in the 1980s, kids going trick or treating kept reducing in

number in most places but not everywhere. In Magnolia, Arkansas, where I had lived for 10 years, the poor kids used to come to my development packed together in the back of pickup trucks. My house was on the corner so they'd run right to my front door as soon as their feet touched the ground. Usually carrying old sacks and no Halloween masks or outfits, they took their free chocolate candy and left within seconds. They were on their own "Mission from God"...and candy was their goal.

As we wait with our bowls overflowing with Halloween treats, those of us who remember what a great time it was for us when we were young, fewer and fewer children come trick or treating. Instead, I heard they go to private parties or to gatherings sponsored by a church. Last year, the first Halloween I spent in a 55+ community, no kids came at all. So, I packed a tote bag with all of my candy, put the leash on my little dog, and went door knocking myself...handing out candy instead of getting it. In return, I made new friends that day. When the recyclable truck pulled up, I ran out with my bag to them too and joined in their happy laughter as I kept saying, "Take some more, please!" When the mailman came, he reached in and pulled out a bag I filled with candy for him too.

Halloween will never be the same as it once was. This unrelenting Covid-19 will put a stake in the heart of this wonderful tradition. No matter how much costly advertising we see on TV trying to convince us to buy their candy, costumes, and decorations, the day will Never Ever be the same.

So, this year, I just may make myself some popcorn with lots of butter and sprawl on the couch covered with a soft afghan.... and watch the 1968 movie, The Night of the Living Dead once again....of course, I'll watch it before the sun goes down and after I go around my development handing out treats to my neighbors.



The Smoke Column

In past articles I had discussed the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) the firefighters must wear while performing their duties. But just wearing their PPE may not be enough to adequately protect the firefighters if the PPE is not worn properly. During recruit training firefighters are taught how to properly don and doff their PPE. They are made to don their PPE many, many times over until they become proficient. They demonstrate this procedure in a timely manner so that when they must don their PPE to respond to an actual fire, they will do so safely and quickly. As they train on donning their PPE, they go through a step-by-step process as to which part of the PPE ensemble goes on first and which follows. The procedure for donning their PPE goes something like: hood first followed by boots, pants, coat, SCBA, mask, helmet, and finally gloves.

The most important thing about donning the PPE is that the entire ensemble fully encapsulates the firefighter. Meaning that there is NO exposed skin. This is absolutely necessary because the firefighter is entering hot toxic atmospheres at temperatures that can approach 1000 degrees or more. Any exposed skin will burn immediately upon entering that atmosphere. The temperature of your home hot water heater is approximately 120-130 degrees and you know how it feels when you do not have the right mix of hot and cold. Imagine the heat and temperatures inside of a burning structure.

Over the years I have seen a common oversight that many firefighters make. After donning their SCBA which has two shoulder straps and a waist strap, they only tighten the two shoulder straps and let the waist strap dangle. This places all the weight of the

SCBA (about 40 pounds) on the shoulders and back of the firefighter. If the waist strap was also connected it would place half of the weight of the SCBA on the waist and hips and relieve the strain on the upper back. Whether they fail to connect the waist strap because it looks "cool" or because they forget could lead to a tragic outcome. As these straps dangle down alongside the firefighter, they have the possibility of getting caught on obstacles on the fire scene especially in deteriorated structures under fire. The buckle on the strap can get caught in a 1/2" crack in the flooring, under a door, or any other small opening and be impossible to extract. Picture yourself in the process of removing a trapped person from a burning structure and being so close to safety only to have this strap get caught on a hidden obstacle and you and the victim succumb to the fire. Yes, this scenario has occurred over and over. If you do not wear your PPE properly and the way it was designed to be worn, you are setting yourself up for a tragic ending. The same can be said for the helmet you wear. It comes with a chin strap to keep it on your head if you get hit from a falling object. Once your helmet falls off your head in a fire structure, you may never find it. The helmet also comes with flaps that go around your ears and neck. Its purpose is not to keep your ears warm in the winter. NO, it is there to protect those areas when you enter high heat atmospheres, use them. I can go on and on with instances that have occurred in the past due to the improper wearing of PPE. I would rather remind you to THINK when wearing your PPE and to wear it as it was designed for. Do not become a statistic and be the focus of one of my future articles. Stay Safe, Stay Healthy.



Americans are living longer than ever. Over the past century the average American lifespan has increased a whopping 27 years. What's the secret to a long and healthy life?

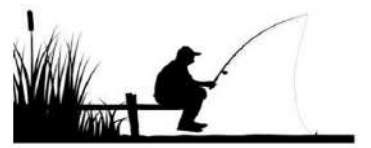

Salt Water

With Fluke season now closed, Party Boats are switching over to Porgies and Sea Bass. Beach fishing in the bay is still slow. The beaches I checked in Keansburg and Cliffwood had not produced any fish-at least not yet. Surf fishing in the ocean especially the beach at Island Beach and LBI is much better. It has been the same litany for several weeks. Many Kingfish, small Bluefish, Sharks and Rays are showing up at night. I heard of a monster Pompano caught on LBI well over 3 pounds that may be a state record if that species was listed as a record. Party boats that fish for Bluefish are now catching some big ones up to 12 pounds. False Albacore are still around along with a few Bonito. Barnegat Bay still has lots of Blowfish along with many short Seabass and some Weakfish. A few winter flounders have been caught in Shark River. A few big Kingfish are mixed in but more Flounder will show up.

Fresh Water

Fall Trout fishing is now in full swing due the State stocking lakes and streams beginning on October 6th. My wife and I fished the Pequest on Columbus Day weekend and found low water conditions everywhere. She only caught one Rainbow about 14 inches. Now that fall has arrived along with the Trout stocking, you can go fishing in any body of water statewide. Fishing in general should improve.

Cuomo/Kovaleski Were Roommates

1952-South Amboy's John Kowaleski (who changed the spelling of his last name to Kovaleski) was playing professional baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates farm system on their Brunswick Class D team in the Georgia-Florida League. It just so happened that his teammate/roommate was Mario Cuomo, who years later went on to become a three-time Governor of New York. They were both rookies in pro ball, and became very good friends, and kept in touch throughout their lifetimes.

In '52, Kowaleski (as he was called back then), easily topped Cuomo in batting average .296 to .244; hits 136-62, and games played 127-81. Due to some serious injuries,

Cuomo hung up his spikes towards the end of the '52 season, trading them in for good, and went on to attend law school. John played a little over a year longer, advancing to the Pirates Class C team, but decided to return to NJ and pursue other avenues. He went on to graduate from Seton Hall University, and became a physical education/health teacher/coach for many years at Hoffman H.S. He was also a longtime basketball official, and in the summer, worked construction in local unions. Kovaleski is believed to be the only baseball player from South Amboy in history, to have been selected to the All-State Baseball team for 3 consecutive years.

Recap-Tom Triggs had the greatest game of his career, by setting 3 school records, and tying 2 others, to lead the Saints to an 80-61 romp, and City Series sweep over archrival Hoffman. Triggs poured in 34 points to eclipse the City Series record of 28, established by Eddie O'Brien in '48. The 5-7 southpaw shooting guard scored 21 points in the first half, to break the school record of 20, which was tied earlier in the season by Triggs' co-captain Jim Doyle. Prior to that the mark was shared by Jack Kreiger and Tom Farrell. Triggs pumped in 14 field goals to set a new record, breaking the previous mark of 13, which was held by Kreiger, Joe Chodkiewicz, and Jim Smelas. Tom's 34 points tied the record for most points in St. Mary's gym, which was held by Farrell and Sayreville's Jeff Osowski. Triggs also tied the mark for most points in a game by an Eagle.

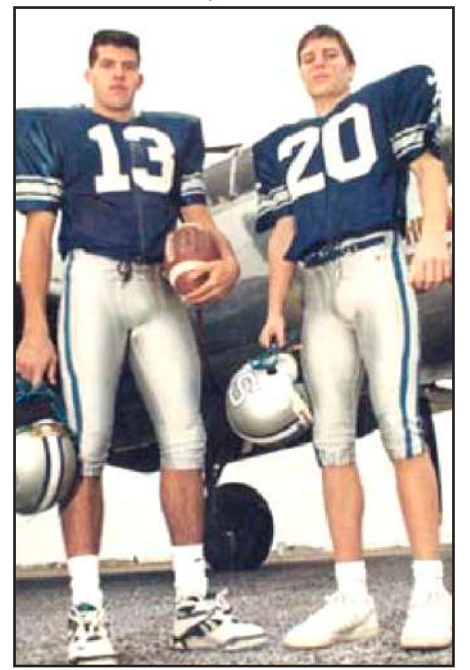

They were both named Co-Players of the Year in 1992 by The Home News Tribune. The '92 team under Coach Sal Mistretta went to the State Championship for the first time in over 22 years.
